The contents of this kit are non-toxic and hypoallergenic, but we recommend testing by applying small test patches of the HairLights and the Glitter Tattoo adhesive to the inner forearm and leaving for ½ hour before applying either. If the test patch shows redness, inflammation, or soreness, wash off immediately and do not apply the products to your skin. Do not apply close to the eyes or mouth. Do not swallow or inhale the products. Use contents within 6 months of opening the individual containers.



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In case of an adverse reaction, wash off immediately with soap and water, and rinse the affected area well with plenty of clean water. If swallowed: Do not induce vomiting. Drink some fresh water and seek medical advice should you suffer any symptoms. In case of eye contact: Wash out eye with plenty of water, holding eye open. Seek immediate medical advice

Clean any spills with kitchen paper and clean water. Dispose of any surplus materials in the household waste.

Choose a design, and carefully peel the backing paper from the stencil. Position the stencil on the skin, and press it gently into place, ensuring that there are no creases or air bubbles in the stencil (it is much easier to apply Glitter Tattoos to flat areas of the body than to curved areas).



Shake the glue bottle, then unscrew the lid and use the brush in the lid to apply a thin coat of the cosmetic glue to the whole cut-out area of the stencil, overlapping the glue by about 2mm onto the edges of the stencil.



Let the glue dry slightly for 30 seconds before applying the glitter.

Unscrew the lid of the pot for the chosen colour of glitter and remove the plastic insert.

Use the soft brush to pick up the particles of glitter and very gently dab these onto the glue, trying not to get glue on the brush.









As soon as you have covered the glue area with glitter, carefully peel the stencil off the skin, leaving the glitter tattoo behind. Do not wait for the glue to dry fully.



If the edges of the tattoo start to lift with the stencil, you can dab them gently with the soft brush to make sure that the tattoo breaks neatly along the edges of the stencil.





Use the stiffer brush to gently brush away any excess glitter which may have stuck to your skin.



You can also make multi-coloured tattoos by applying glitter to a selected area of the glued stencil, then tapping the glitter off the soft brush and applying a second colour to another area. You need to have all your glitters ready before doing this, as the glue dries quite quickly!



Removing Glitter Tattoos

Glitter Tattoos can be washed off the skin with soap and warm water. Soaking the Glitter Tattoo in warm water (such as in the bath or shower) for a few minutes will soften the glue and make them easier to wash off.

After removal it is a good idea to apply skin moisturiser to the area where you had the Glitter Tattoo.







Use the small stencils on your fingers to make ring tattoos!







Although the Hair Shadow product will wash out of your hair easily, it can stain the skin, so always wear the gloves provided when applying Hairlights.

It is best to apply Hairlights little by little, so select a small section of hair and separate it with a hairdresser's clip.



Open the container and gently rub the

Hair Shadow down the length of hair that you want to colour. Repeat this action several times, always going from top to bottom. The more you repeat this action, the more colour will be left on your hair.





Streaks

You can colour streaks in your hair by repeating this process with different colours on different strands of hair.



Dip Dye

To create multi-colour dip dye in your hair, start at the bottom of your hair. Put the hairdresser's clips where you want your first colour to start, about 4-5cm from the bottom of your hair works well. Apply the first colour, covering all the strands with colour, then move the clips up to where you

Once you have covered all the hair in the second colour, move the clips up again to where you want your third colour to start. Colour this section between the clips and the second colour evenly. Get a friend to help if you have trouble reaching the back!



Why not try this!: Using one colour to create an Ombré look!



Plaiting

Plaiting either streaks of colour or 'dip dye' hair can give a whole new look to your hair!








Wash your hands and nails well, making sure to remove any dirt under your nails using a soap, a nail brush and warm water.

Trim your nails with a finger-nail cutter if they are too long, and file them gently using the nail file supplied to remove any sharp edges. Only file the tip of the nail, not the top surface, as filing the top surface will weaken the nail.

After filing your nails, always wash and thoroughly dry your hands to make sure that nail dust cannot spoil your nail polish.

Painting Your Nails - Base Coat

Always shake the nail polish before use to ensure that the colours are evenly mixed. For best results you should paint your nails with smooth, continuous strokes of the brush, starting at the base of the nail (the cuticle) and painting towards the tip of the nail in a single stroke, using the brush supplied inside the lid of each nail polish. After dipping the brush in the nail polish, wipe the brush on the inside of the bottle neck to remove the excess paint and form the bristles of the brush into a good shape.



You should be able to paint smaller nails in two strokes of the brush, as shown:

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Larger nails will need three strokes of the brush:

1 2 3

It is better to apply several thin coats of nail polish, rather than one thick coat, because this will produce a more even application. Most colours will only need two coats, but light colours, such as white, may need three coats. Allow each coat to dry before applying the next coat - if you apply the next coat too soon, the nail polish may lack gloss, or become streaky.

If you make a mistake, wait for the nail polish to dry, peel it off the nail (or wash it off the skin with soap and warm water), dry the nail and start again.

Nail Art

Make sure that the base coat of nail polish is completely dry before painting designs onto it.

Use the small paint brush to paint the designs onto your nails. Apply a tiny amount of paint to the brush, wipe the brush on the inside of the bottle neck to remove the excess paint and form the bristles of the brush into a good shape, then hold the brush vertically (as shown) and lower it gently onto the nail to begin painting. It requires patience to get this exactly right, so you may need to try a couple of times before you get it right!







- Do not overload the brush.
- Paint using only the tip of the brush. Keep the brush vertical at all times.

Where possible, it is best to paint paler colours onto the nail first, so to paint the pink heart design onto a black background, it is best to paint the nail pink first, then paint the black outline of the heart shape onto the nail, then paint black around the heart shape.

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Top Tip!

 To paint a dot, it is best to paint in a very small circle on the nail.



Design your own

Here are some designs that we like, shown step by step. You can use these as inspiration and then go on to design your own.



Removing the Nail Polish

Once the nail varnish is dry, it can be peeled off your nail in a single sheet.

Any excess that is stuck to the skin can be removed using soap and warm water.





To add the star or heart shapes to your nail design, put a tiny dot of transparent nail polish where you want to put the shape, then pick up the shape using the brush (the residue of the nail varnish will pick up the shape).

Position the shape and press it gently into the dot of polish. Allow the dot to dry for a minute, then once you have added as many shapes as you want, paint over the whole nail with a coat of transparent polish using the brush in the bottle top. The transparent polish also makes a good protective coat for your designs.
