introduction

This kit is all about making your own Dreamcatcher Jewellery using feathers, beads, charms and colourful threads. They are fun and easy to make... just follow the instructions carefully to express your creativity.






Project 1:

Macklass

For this project you will need:


- 1 x Plastic Loop
- 1 Length of Faux Suede Cord
- 20cm Pink Thread
- 40cm Silver Thread
- A Selection of Beads
- I. Take I length of the faux suede cord. For this project we have used purple. Cut the cord in half so you have two equal lengths of 60cm.
- **2.** Starting at the bottom of the loop, leave 6cm of cord then wrap the cord around the loop.































Project I: continued

6. When you reach the centre, thread a bead onto the silver thread.



7. Finish off the design by weaving the silver thread to the edge of the loop and tying a knot. Trim off any excess.





8. Cut 20cm of pink cord. (this is the thin cord in the kit) Knot the cord at the bottom of the loop around the purple cord. Create this knot on the back of your pendant.



9. Add a clamshell clasp to the feather by threading the feathers stem up inside the clamshell clasp and pinching it to close.




10. Thread the feather onto the pink cord and tie a knot above. You can also add extra beads to each length of cord to make fun dangles.



Project 2:

Bracolot

1. Cut 80cm of blue cord. Knot the cord onto the loop.



2. Wrap the cord all the way around the loop. Knot to finish. Trim off any excess cord.



3. Cut 40cm of silver thread, then create a 'web' in the centre of the loop as you did in Project 1. Knot to finish.

4. Now cut two lengths of blue cord. I x 35cm, I x 70cm.

thread it through the small link at one end of the loop. Double over creating two lengths.



6. Hold the 35cm length of cord together with the other two lengths and knot all three lengths together.


7. Add a bead to one of the cords, then knot all cords together after the bead.

8. Plait the three cord for 8-10cm. Knot to finish and trim off any excess cord.

9. Repeat steps 5 - 9 on the other end of the loop to complete your bracelet.

Add a metal charm to personalise your design! Or weave the web in coloured cord to customise your design.




Project 3:


- 1. Attach an ear hook to each metal loop using two jump rings.
- 2. To open and close a jump ring hold tightly in your fingers, push one end forward and one end back. Once open, link in your metal loop and twist to close.
- **3.** Use a second jump ring to attach the ear hook.

Project 4:

Gord Modelan

- 1. Cut Im of pink cord.
- **2.** Knot the pink cord to the bottom of the loop 10cm from one end of the cord. Wrap the long length of cord around the loop.





3. When you have wrapped the whole loop with cord, double knot the cord together at the bottom of the loop.



Leave the tails of the cords hanging for now as you will use them later to add feathers.



4. Cut 40cm of pink (or silver) cord and weave a web in the centre of the loop as you did in other projects.

5. Take two feathers and add clamshell clasps to each.

6. Add the feathers to each of the hanging blue cords. Trim off any excess.

7. To finish your necklace, cut 60cm of blue cord, thread the cord through the top link of the loop and double knot.

8. To secure the necklace around your neck, tie the cord into a bow.

Top Tip:

You can add a bead or two
for a 'pop' of colour.
