

BLUESTONE

Distinctively bluish-grey in tone, increasingly rare bluestone melds rough-hewn material with smooth sophistication. White mineral lines and subtle color, texture and pattern variations are to be expected and speak to each stone's individual nature.

Care for Your Bluestone Surfaces

- > Address spills immediately by wiping with a dry, soft cloth.
- > Spot-clean as needed with a soft cloth and mild soap.
- > Avoid use of cleaning products with acid, vinegar, lemon and ammonia, as abrasive ingredients can damage stone.
- > Bluestone surfaces are not scratch- or heat-resistant, and may scuff or stain without proper care. To maintain stone's natural appearance, avoid sharp objects on surfaces. Use coasters, trivets and placemats for protection against hot or wet items.
