

## How to colour in your Golden Ox in 5 easy stages

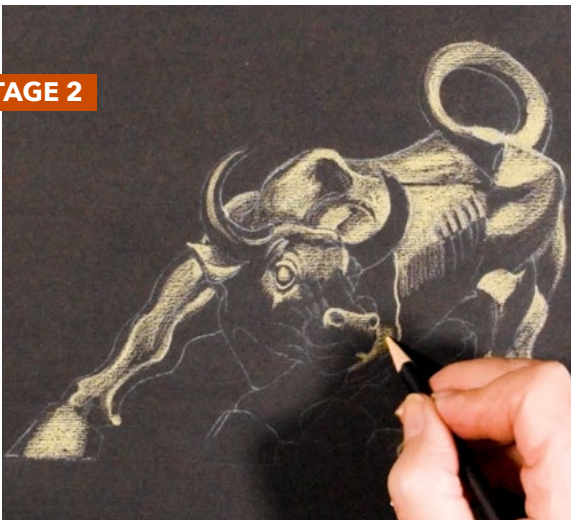

### STAGE 1



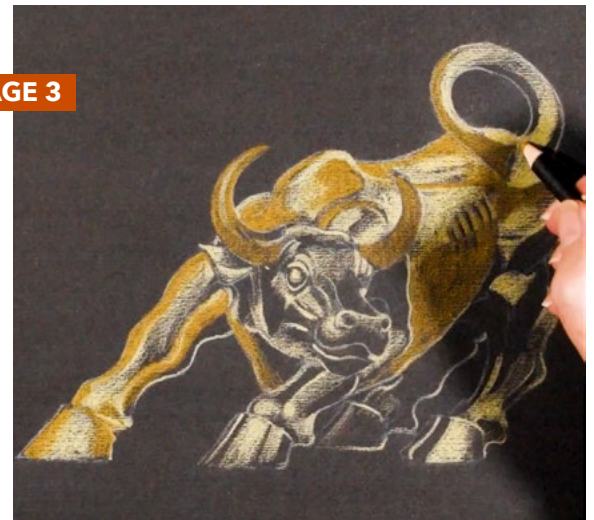
To begin our illustration we need to trace the image down in white pencil onto a dark paper.

### STAGE 2



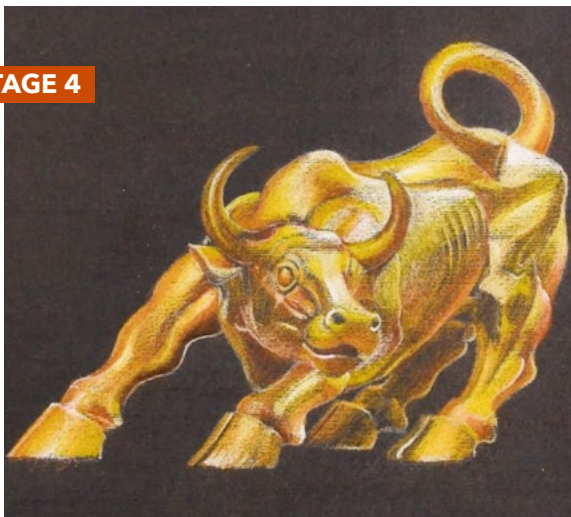
Next add an initial base of pale yellow, noting the tonal values as you go. Even at this early stage we see the ox taking shape.

### STAGE 3



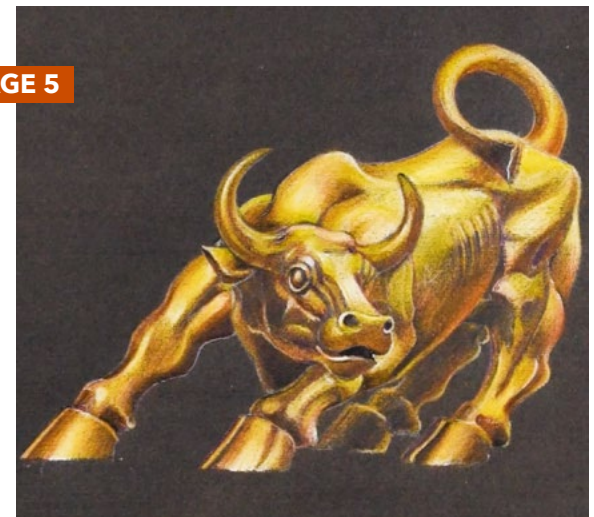
Keep on intensifying the drawing by gradually adding further layers of golden colour and tone.

### STAGE 4



Now more golden tones are achieved by introducing some brown shading and some subtle blending to enrich the colours.

### STAGE 5



Finally, with black details, further blending, and some highlights in white, this golden ox is set to celebrate a prosperous Chinese New Year!
