AOP La Clape

Heritage



Winemaker's note

Château de Tarailhan is located on the Massif of la Clape, a former island between Narbonne and the Mediterranean. The vineyard, between land and sea, benefits from the Mediterranean climate but also from the sea winds. It is an ancient estate in which we have discovered remnants of the Merovingian era. It was also the residence of Narbonne consuls during the 16th and 17th centuries. Today, the vines are surrounded by garrigue and organic crops. They are cultivated in the utmost respect of nature, and the estate is currently undergoing conversion to biodynamics.



Winegrower's note

The estate is cultivated in a very qualitative way with moderate yields around 35hl/ha, in order to obtain concentrated and aromatic grapes. These are harvested by hand at optimal maturity, de-stemmed and put in thermo-regulated stainless-steel vats for a slow maturation. The different varietals are vinified separately in the traditional way. The wine is aged in 225 liters barrels for 12 months.



Tasting notes

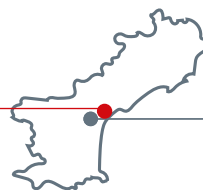
Deep ruby colour. On the nose, fruity aromas of black cherry and redcurrant accompanied by notes of sweet spices. Complex and greedy on the fruit on the palate, we also find liquorice and gingerbread aromas. It is also distinguished by its fine and elegant tannins, as well as by its remarkable length in the mouth.
