#### **MATERIALS**

- 790-329 <u>Lion Brand</u>
   <u>Homespun Yarn: Waterfall</u>

   7 Balls
- <u>Lion Brand Crochet Hook -</u> <u>Size K-10.5 (6.5 mm)</u>
- <u>Lion Brand Crochet Hook -</u> <u>Size J-10 (6 mm)</u>

\*Homespun® (Article #790). 98% Acrylic, 2% Polyester; package size: 6.00oz/170.00 gr. (185yds/169m) pull



#### **GAUGE:**

10 sts = 4 inches (10 cm) in double crochet with larger sized hook Square measures 11 inches (28 cm) square

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

## **SQUARES** - Make 20

Ch 8, join with slip st in first ch to form ring.}

**Rnd 1** Ch 3 – counts as first dc, make 15 dc in ring, slip st to top of beg ch-3 to join – 16 dc.

Rnd 2 Ch 3 – counts as first dc, dc in same dc; make 2 dc in every dc around, slip st to top of beg ch-3 to join – 32 dc.

**Rnd 3** Ch 1, sc in joining st; (ch 1, dc in next 2 dc, ch 1, sc in next dc \*\*, sc in next dc) around, ending \*\*, slip st to top of beg sc to join.

**Rnd 4** Slip st to next dc. Ch 3 – *counts as first dc*, make 2 more dc in same dc, [make 3 dc in next dc, skip next (ch 1, 2 sc, ch 1), ch 1, make 3 dc in next dc, ch 3, make 3 dc in next dc, skip next (ch 1, 2 sc, ch 1), ch 1, make 3 dc in next dc] around, ending slip st to top of beg ch-3 to join.

**Rnd 5** Slip st to 3<sup>rd</sup> dc. Ch 1, sc in same st, sc in next st, [ch 3, sc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, make (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-3 space, ch 1, sc in next ch-1 space, ch 3\*, skip next 2 dc, sc in next 2 dc] around, ending \*, slip st in top of first sc to join.

**Rnd 6** Ch 3 – counts as first dc, dc in same st, [2 dc in next sc, ch 1, make 3 dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, make (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-3 space, ch 1, make 3 dc in next ch-1 space, skip 3 ch\*, make 2 dc in next sc] around, ending \*, slip st to top of beg ch-3 to join.

**Rnd 7** Ch 3 – *counts as first dc*, dc in every st and ch around, making (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in every corner ch-3 space and ending by slip st to top of beg ch-3 to join. Fasten off

# **FINISHING**

Sew 4 squares tog to form strip. Sew 5 strips of squares tog.

# **Edging**

- **Rnd 1** With smaller-sized hook, attach yarn and sc in each st around, making (2 sc, ch 1, 2 sc) in all ch-3 corner spaces, and slip st to beg sc to join at end of round.
- **Rnd 2** Ch 4, (skip 1 sc, dc in next sc, ch 1) around, making (dc, ch 3, dc) in every corner ch-1. Slip st to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of beg ch-4 to join.
- **Rnd 3** Sc in every dc and ch around, making (2 sc, ch 1, 2 sc in every ch-3 corner space. Slip st to top of first sc to join.

### **Picot Edging**

(Ch 2, slip st in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, skip 1 sc, slip st in next 2 sc) around. Fasten off. Weave in loose ends.
