For vintage fashion lovers, add this lacy poncho to your wardrobe.

### Free Knitting Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn Lion Brand® Wool-Ease® Chunky Lace Poncho

Pattern Number: 40461

**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy (Level 2) **SIZE:** Small, Medium, Large

1 rectangle, 181/2" wide x 49 (52, 55) inches long [47 x 124.5 (132, 139.5) cm]

**Note:** Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

#### **MATERIALS**

- 630-402 <u>Lion Brand Wool-Ease</u> <u>Chunky Yarn: Wheat</u> 2 (3, 3) Balls
- <u>Lion Brand Knitting Needles Size</u>
   11 [8 mm]
- <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt</u>
   <u>Needles (Set of 6)</u>

\*Wool-Ease Chunky (Article #630). **Solids:** 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool;

**301 Tinsel White:** 78% Acrylic, 19% Wool, 3% Other; **402 Wheat:** 86% Acrylic, 10% Wool, 4% Other; package size: 5.00oz/140.00 gr. (153yds/140m) pull skeins



#### **GAUGE:**

12 sts + 16 rows = 4 inches [10 cm] in Lace Pattern.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

**ssk (slip, slip, knit)** Slip next 2 sts as if to knit, one at a time, to right needle; insert left needle into fronts of these 2 sts and k them together.

PATTERN STITCH Lace Pattern (multiple of 6 sts) Row 1 (right side)

\*K 1, yo, ssk; repeat from \*.

Row 2 and all wrong side rows Purl. Row 3 \*K 2, yo, ssk, k 2; repeat from \*. Row 5 \*K 3, yo, ssk, k 1; repeat from \*. Row 6 Purl.

Repeat Rows 1-6 for Lace Pattern.

#### **PONCHO**

#### Row 1

Slip first st as if to knit, knit to end.

Work Row 1 for 6 rows total.

#### Pattern Row 1

Slip first st as if to knit, knit 3, work Lace Pattern Row 1 to last 4 sts, knit 4.

#### Pattern Row 2


Slip first st as if to knit, knit 3, work Lace Pattern Row 2 to last 4 sts, knit 4.

Continue in pattern as established until piece measures 48 (51, 54) inches [122 (129.5, 137) cm] from beginning.

Work Row 1 of Poncho Pattern 5 times. Bind off loosely.

#### **FINISHING**

Sew short end to side edge. Weave in ends.
