# Free Crochet Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn Lion Brand. Lion Suede - Moonlight Mohair Crochet Short Jacket

SKILL LEVEL: Experienced

**SIZE:** Small, Medium, Large, 1X, 2X, 3X **Finished Bust** 40 (44, 48, 52, 56, 60) in. [101.5 (111.5, 122, 132, 142, 152.5) cm] **Finished Length** 23 (23, 24 1/2, 24 1/2, 26, 26) in. [58.5 (58.5, 62, 62, 66, 66) cm] Jacket is very fitted. Bottom edge is narrower than bust.

**Note:** Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

# **MATERIALS**

- 210-123 <u>Lion Brand Lion Suede Yarn: Taupe</u> 7 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 Balls (A)
- 510-204 Lion Brand Moonlight Mohair Yarn: Rainbow Falls 8 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 Balls (B)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook Size K-10.5
- Lion Brand Stitch Markers
- Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
- Additional Materials
  - 1 plastic ring 1 1/2 in. [4 cm] diameter, for crochet button

### GAUGE:

7 hdc2tog + 6 rows = 4 in. [10 cm] in pattern with 1 strand each of A and B held tog. BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you less stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

hdc2tog Yarn over hook, insert hook into st, draw up loop, yarn over hook, insert hook into next st and draw up loop, yarn over hook and draw through all 5 loops on hook. hdc3tog Yarn over hook, insert hook into st, draw up loop, (yarn over hook, draw up a loop in next st) twice, yarn over hook and draw through all 7 loops on hook.

#### PATTERN STITCH

Row 1 (RS): Hdc2tog into 3rd and 4th ch from hook, \*hdc2tog inserting hook into same ch as st just worked and next ch; repeat from \* across, end hdc in last ch.
Row 2: Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog into first and 2nd sts, \*hdc2tog inserting hook into same st as st just worked and next st; repeat from \* across, end hdc in top of ch-2.
Repeat Row 2 for pattern.
Note Beg ch-2 and last hdc are not included in stitch count.


# NOTES:

1. Take care in setting up first 2 rows to establish pattern.

2. To maintain st count, be sure to work end of row as written, working hdc2tog into 2nd to last and last sts and hdc into turning ch. Check work from time to time to be sure hdc2togs are

lining up and st count is maintained.

3. Jacket is worked with 1 strand each of A and B held together, unless otherwise noted.



### BODY

With 1 strand each of A and B held tog, ch 50 (57, 64, 71, 78, 85) loosely.

**Row 1 (RS):** Hdc2tog in 3rd and 4th ch from hook, \*hdc2tog inserting hook into ch just worked and next ch; repeat from \* across, end hdc in last ch - 46 (53, 60, 67, 74, 81) sts.

**Row 2 (Front Inc Row):** Ch 2, turn, 2 hdc in first st (front inc made), (hdc2tog inserting hook into st just worked and next st) 10 (12, 14, 16, 18, 20) times, place marker to mark side seam, (hdc2tog inserting hook into st just worked and next st) 24 (27, 30, 33, 36, 39) times, place marker to mark left side seam, (hdc2tog inserting hook into st just worked and next st) 10 (12, 14, 16, 18, 20) times, 2 hdc in last st (front inc made),

hdc in beg ch-2 - 48 (55, 62, 69, 76, 83) sts.

**Row 3 (Side Inc Row):** Ch 2, turn, \*work in pattern to 1 st before marker, 2 hdc in st before marker (side inc made), move marker, 2 hdc in st after marker (side inc made), repeat from \* once, finish row in pattern - 52 (59, 66, 73, 80, 87) sts. **Row 4:** Work even in pattern.

**Row 5 (Front Inc Row):** Ch 2, turn, 2 hdc in first st (front inc made), work in pattern to last st, 2 hdc in last st (front inc made) - 54 (61, 68, 75, 82, 89) sts.

**Row 6:** Work even in pattern.

**Row 7 (Side Inc Row):** Repeat Row 3 - 58 (65, 72, 79, 86, 93) sts.

Rows 8 and 9: Work even in pattern.

**Row 10 (Front and Side Inc Row):** Ch 2, turn, 2 hdc in first st (front inc made), \*work in pattern to 1 st before marker, 2 hdc in st before marker (side inc made), move marker, 2 hdc in st after marker (side inc made), repeat from \* once, work in pattern to last st, 2 hdc in last st (front inc made) - 64 (71, 78, 85, 92, 99) sts.

Rows 11-13: Work even in pattern.

**Row 14 (Side Inc Row):** Repeat Row 3 - 68 (75, 82, 89, 96, 103) sts.

**Row 15 (Front Inc Row):** Repeat Row 5 - 70 (77, 84, 91, 98, 105) sts.

Row 16: Work even in pattern.

**For L and 1X only:** Work 2 rows even in pattern (additional rows are not included in row count).

**For 2X and 3X only:** Work 4 rows even in pattern (additional rows are not included in row count).

### RIGHT FRONT

#### Shape Armhole

**Row 17 (RS):** Work in pattern to 3 sts before marker; leave remaining sts unworked.

**Row 18:** Turn, sl st in first st, ch 2, work in pattern across remaining 15 (17, 19, 21, 23, 25) sts.

#### Row 19: Work even in pattern.

Rows 20 (Front Inc Row): Continue in pattern, working 2 hdc at Front Edge - 16 (18, 20, 22, 24, 26) sts. Rows 21-24: Work even in pattern.

**Rows 25-28:** Repeat Rows 20 and 21 twice - 18 (20, 22, 24, 26, 28) sts.

### Shape Neck

**Row 29 (RS):** Turn, sl st in 5 (6, 7, 8, 9, 10) sts, ch 2, work in pattern across remaining 13 (14, 15, 16, 17, 18) sts. **Row 30:** Work in pattern to last 2 sts; leave last 2 sts unworked - 11 (12, 13, 14, 15, 16) sts. **Row 31:** Turn, sl st in first 2 sts, ch 2, work in pattern across - 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14) sts.

Row 32: Work even in pattern.

### Shape Shoulder

Row 33 (RS): Work in pattern across 6 (7, 8, 8, 9, 10) sts;

leave remaining 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts unworked.

Row 34: Turn, sl st in 3 (3, 4, 4, 4, 5) sts, ch 2, work in

pattern across 3 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts.

**Row 35:** Work in pattern across 3 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts. Fasten off.

#### ВАСК

#### Shape Armhole

**Row 17 (RS):** Sk 4 sts from Right Front Armhole, join yarn in next st, ch 2, work in pattern across 30 (33, 36, 39, 42, 45) sts; leave remaining sts unworked.

**Row 18:** Turn, sl st in first st, ch 2, work in pattern to last st; leave last st unworked - 28 (31, 34, 37, 40, 43) sts.

#### Rows 19-32: Work even in pattern. Shape Left Shoulder

**Row 33:** Turn, sl st in 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts, ch 2, work in pattern across 6 (7, 8, 8, 9, 10) sts.

**Row 34:** Work in pattern across 3 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts; leave remaining 3 (3, 4, 4, 4, 5) sts unworked.

Row 35: Work in pattern across 3 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts. Fasten off.

From RS, skip 10 (11, 12, 13, 14, 15) Back neck sts. Join yarn in next st, ch 2. Shape Right Shoulder as for Left, reversing shaping. Fasten off.

# LEFT FRONT

Row 17 (RS): Sk 4 sts from Back Armhole, join yarn in next st, ch 2, work in pattern across 16 (18, 20, 22, 24, 26) sts.
Row 18: Ch 2, turn, work in pattern across 15 (17, 19, 21, 23, 25) sts; leave last st unworked.
Continue as for Right Front, reversing shaping.

#### SLEEVE (make 2)

Beg at wrist edge, with 1 strand each of A and B held together, ch 31 (31, 31, 33, 33, 33); sl st in first ch to form ring, taking

care not to twist sts.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Working in rnds, ch 2, hdc2tog in first and 2nd ch, (hdc2tog into st just worked and next st) around, join with sl st in top of ch-2 - 30 (30, 30, 32, 32, 32) hdc2tog. **Rnds 2-4:** Ch 2, work even in pattern, join with sl st in top of

ch-2 every rnd.

**Rnd 5:** Continue in pattern, working 3 hdc3tog evenly spaced around - 27 (27, 27, 29, 29, 29) sts.

Rnds 6-9: Work even in pattern.

Rnd 10: Repeat Rnd 5 - 24 (24, 24, 26, 26, 26) sts.

Rnds 11-14: Work even in pattern.

**Rnd 15:** Repeat Rnd 5 one (one, 0, 0, 0, 0) time - 21 (21, 24, 26, 26, 26) sts.

Rnds 16-29: Work even in pattern.

**Rnd 30:** 2 hdc in first st, work in pattern to center st, 2 hdc in center st, work in pattern to last st, 2 hdc in last st - 24 (24, 27, 29, 29, 29, 29) sts.

Rnds 31-40: Work even in pattern.

For L and 1X only: Work 1 rnd even in pattern (additional rnd is not included in row count).

For 2X and 3X only: Work 2 rnds even in pattern (additional rnds are not included in row count).


### Shape Cap

**Row 41:** Turn, working back and forth in rows as for Body, sl st in 2 sts, ch 2, work in pattern across to last 2 sts; leave last 2 sts unworked - 20 (20, 23, 25, 25, 25) sts.

Row 42: Work even in pattern.

**For 2X and 3X only:** Work 1 row even in pattern (additional row is not included in row count).

**Rows 43 and 45:** Turn, sl st in first st, ch 2, work in pattern to last st; leave last st unworked - 16 (16, 19, 21, 21, 21) sts. **Rows 44 and 46:** Work even in pattern. Fasten off.



#### FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Sew in sleeves.

#### Collar

From RS, with 1 strand each of A and B held tog, join yarn at Right Front, ch 2.

**Row 1:** Hdc2tog into first and 2nd sts, hdc2tog inserting hook into same st as st just worked and next st, (ch 4, sk 4 sts) for buttonhole, hdc2tog in next 2 sts, (hdc2tog inserting hook into same st as st just worked and next st) 26 (26, 28, 30, 30, 32) times evenly spaced around neck edge easing to fit.

Row 2: Continue in pattern, working 6 hdc in buttonhole.

Rows 3 and 4: Work even in pattern. Fasten off.

# Trim

From RS, join A only and sc evenly around edges of coat, working 3 sc in each corner, sl st in first sc. Do not turn.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, working 3 sc in corners, sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

# **Crochet Button**

With 1 strand each A and B held tog.Rnd 1: Work 20 sc around ring.Rnd 2: Ch 1, work approximately 20 sc over Rnd 1. Fasten off.Sew button to Left Front, opposite buttonhole.

\*<u>Moonlight Mohair</u> (Article #510) Moonlight Mohair is a bulky weight yarn that mixes a strand of soft mohair with a slubbed, sparkly, multi-colored yarn. Bulky Weight 1¼ oz/50 g; 82 yards/75m 35% Mohair, 30% Acrylic, 25% cotton, 10% metallic polyester, it is packaged in 1 3/4 oz/82 yd balls

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
