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SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: One Size

MATERIALS

• 830-122 Lion Brand Cotton-

Ease Yarn: Taupe

1 Ball (A)

• 830-110 Lion Brand Cotton-

Ease Yarn: Lake

1 Ball (B)

• 830-194 Lion Brand Cotton-

Ease Yarn: Lime

1 Ball (C)

• Lion Brand Knitting Needles

- Size 7 [4.5 mm]

• Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt

Needles (Set of 6)

*<u>Cotton-Ease (</u>Article #830). 50% Cotton, 50% Acrylic; package size: 3.50oz/100.00 gr. (207yds/188m) pull skeins



GAUGE:

Exact gauge is not essential to this project.

STITCH EXPLANATION:

PATTERN STITCHES

Seed Stitch (worked over an odd number of sts)

Row 1: K1, *p1, k1, rep from * across.

Row 2: K the purl sts and p the knit sts.

Rep Row 2 for Seed st.

STRIPE SEQUENCE

*Work 2 rows each with A, B and C; rep from * for Stripe Sequence.

NOTES:

Carry color(s) not in use along side edge of work.

WASHCLOTH

With A, cast on 41 sts.

Rows 1 and 2: With A, work in Seed st.

Rows 3 and 4: With B, work in Seed st.

Rows 5 and 6: With C, work in Seed st.

Row 7: With A, work in Seed st as established over first 4 sts, k to last 4 sts, work in Seed st over last 4 sts. Rep Row 7, changing color following Stripe Sequence, until piece measures about 9 in. (23 cm) from beginning. Continuing in Stripe Sequence, work in Seed st for 6 rows. Bind off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
