*Skill Level: Beginner*

**SIZE:** 5 inches [approximately 10 cm]

**MATERIALS**

• LION BRAND Fun Fur

1 ball #100 White

COLOR OF YOUR CHOICE

- Scrap yarn for eyes, approximately 4 inches [10 cm] black and white
- Small quantity white felt for ears
- Small quantity pink felt for ears
- Size F-3/3.75 LION BRAND Crochet Hook
- Sewing needle and matching thread
- 1 oz polyester stuffing
- 24 inches [approximately 61 cm] of ribbon
- White 1/2 inch [approximately 13 cm] pom-pom

**GAUGE:**

24 scs x 16 rows = 4" (10 cm)

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE

**BUNNY**

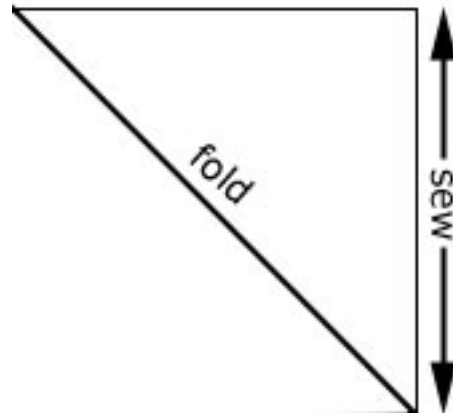
Chain 21.

**Row 1** Sc (single crochet) in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, and in each ch across – 20 sc.

**Row 2** Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Rep last row 12 more times, or until piece is square. End off. Cut yarn.

Fold square in half and stitch as shown



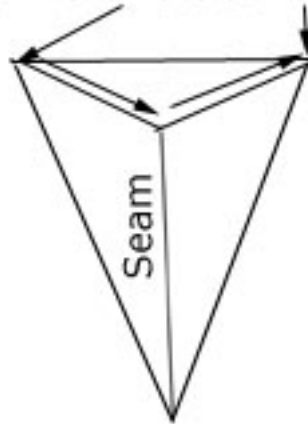
Hold like a cone, fill with stuffing



Turn the fabric and open it -- it will be a cone. Put the stuffing into it. Position stuffing with your finger to make the Bunny the shape you'd like (you can always adjust this later, as well)

Fold down top flap and sew the open edges shut.

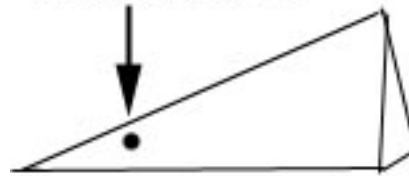
Stitch from here to here



Fold down the flap at the top of the cone. Sew the open edges closed.

To put eyes on the bunny, pull the crochet hook all the way through the bunny's 'head' and use it to pull the black and white yarn through together. Tie it off securely on one end (use several knots). Pull it tight and tie off on the other end (use several knots). Trim closely.

create eyes by using crochet hook to pull black and white yarns through and tying both ends in a knot

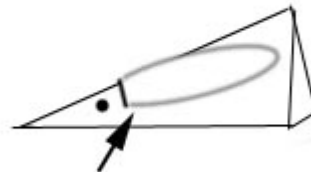


Cut 2 inner ears and 2 outer ears from felt, per pattern:

Ears -- Cut two of each; pink is inner ear



Using needle and thread, position one inner ear and one outer ear together. Fold in half and sew one set on each side of the bunny's head.



Attach ears with thread and a few stitches

cut approximately 6 inches [15 cm] of ribbon and tie around bunny's neck as shown.



If this Bunny will be used as a bookmark, sew remainder of ribbon to its underside and sew the pom-pom on the end as shown

Adjust position of stuffing so Bunny is the shape you want.

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**ABBREVIATIONS**

ch = <u>chain</u>	rep = repeat(ing)
sc = <u>single crochet</u>	st(s) = stitch(es)
