

Free Knitting Pattern Lion Brand[®] Lion[®] Wool - Ruffles[®] Baby Abby's Ruffled Bloomers Pattern Number: BK4K-0704001



This densely-knit soaker-style diaper cover is made of 100% wool and Ruffles yarn. It is perfect for daytime wear over fabric or disposable diapers. Got a boy? Just omit the ruffles and use the optional leg cuff pattern for a more manly look on these little pants.

SKILL LEVEL: Easy

SIZE: 12 mos

Waist: About 13 in (33 cm) Note that the waistband will stretch somewhat with time

Hip: 18.5 in (47 cm) **Rise:** 9½ in (24 cm) **Leg Opening:** 9 in (23 cm)

CORRECTIONS: (applied Nov 16, 2009)

Row 2, 4, 6: P2, *k1, p2, rep from * to end of row

MATERIALS

- 820-099 Lion Brand Lion Wool Yarn: Winter White
 - 1 Ball (A)
- 410-098 Lion Brand Ruffles Yarn: Cream
 - 1 Ball (B)
- Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 5 [3.75 mm]
- Lion Brand Double-Pointed Needles Size 5
- Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
- Additional Materials
 - 1 yard 3/8 inch (1 cm) ribbon, color of your choice
 - sewing needle and thread

GAUGE:

22 sts x 28 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in stockinette stitch with A BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you less stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

NOTES:

Ruffles yarn requires a special, yet simple, technique. The loops are formed by inserting the needle into this tape-fabric yarn. Click <u>here</u> for a short instructional video and audio description about working with Ruffles.

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With A, cast on 35 sts.
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Row 1: K2, *p1, k2 rep from * to end of row

Row 2, 4, 6: P2, *k1, p2, rep from * to end of row

Row 3: rep row 1

Row 4: rep row 2

Row 5: K2, *k2 tog, k, rep from * to end of row (this creates the eyelet row for the ribbon);

Row 6: P2, *yo, p2, rep from * to end of row

Row 7-10: rep rows 1-2

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Row 11: Kfb, knit to last 2 stitches, kfb - 37 sts
Row 12 and all even rows through row 26, purl
Row 13: Kfb, knit to last 2 stitches, kfb - 39 sts
Row 15: Kfb, knit to last 2 stitches, kfb - 41 sts
Row 17: Kfb, knit to last 2 stitches, kfb - 43 sts
Row 19: Kfb, knit to last 2 stitches, kfb - 45 sts
Row 21: Kfb, knit to last 2 stitches, kfb - 47 sts
Row 23: Kfb, knit to last 2 stitches, kfb - 49 sts
Row 25: Kfb, knit to last 2 stitches, kfb - 51 sts
Row 27: Holding one strand of A and B together, purl to end of row -- make sure ruffle is on the right (knit) side of
the garment. at end of row; carry Ruffles up the side of the garment.
Row 28: With A only, purl to end of row
Row 29: Knit
Row 30: Holding one strand of A and B together, knit to end of row -- make sure ruffle is on the right (knit) side of
the garment. At end of row, carry Ruffles up the side of the garment.
Row 31: With A only, knit to end of row
Row 32: Purl to end of row
Rows 33-56: Repeat rows 27-32 (4 times)
Row 57: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches k2tog - 49 sts
Row 58: P2tog, purl to last 2 stitches, p2tog - 47 sts
Rows 59-64: Rep rows 57 and 58 - - 33 stitches will remain at row 64
Row 65: Rep Row 57. Row 66: Purl
Row 67: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 31 sts
Row 68: Purl
Row 69: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 27 sts
Row 70: Purl
Row 71: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 25 sts
Row 72: purl
Row 73: knit
Row 74: purl
Rows 75-80: rep rows 73 and 74
Row 81: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 27 sts
Row 82 and all even rows through row 130: purl
Row 83: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 29 sts
Row 85: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 31 sts
Row 87: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 33 sts
Row 89: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 35 sts
Row 91: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 37 sts
Row 93: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 41 sts
Row 95: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 43 sts
Row 97: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 45 sts
Row 99: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 47 sts
Row 101: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 49 sts
Row 103: Kfb, knit until one stitch remains, kfb - 51 sts
Rows 105-113: knit
Row 115: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 49 sts
Row 117: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 47 sts
Row 119: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 45 sts
Row 121: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 43 sts
Row 123: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 41 sts
Row 125: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 39 sts
Row 127: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 37 sts
Row 129: K2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog - 35 sts
Row 131: K2, * p1, k2, rep from * to end of row
Row 132, 134, 136: P2, *k1, p2, rep from * to end of row.
Row 133, 135: rep row 131
Row 137: K2, *k2 tog, k, rep from * to end of row (this creates the eyelet row for the ribbon);
Row 138: P2, *yo, p2, rep from * to end of row
Row 139: K2, * p1, k2, rep from * to end of row
Row 140: P2, *k1, p2, rep from * to end of row
Row 141: K2, * p1, k2, rep from * to end of row
Bind off all stitches, leaving an end of about 16 inches for sewing.
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FINISHING:

Sew up side seams, weave in ends. Weave ribbon through eyelets in waistband. Using sewing needle and thread,

secure the ribbon so it cannot come loose.

Note: If baby is old enough to enjoy untying things, it may be prudent to put the bow in the back where it will be difficult to reach.

Optional Leg Cuff:

Using 5 double-pointed needles, pick up 60 stitches around the leg openings. With A, k2, p1 around for 8 rows. Bind off very loosely so the cuff will stretch comfortably, weave in ends.

Optional Leg Ruffle:

Using 5 double-pointed needles, pick up 60 stitches around the leg openings. With B, knit around for 2 rows. Bind off very loosely so the cuff will stretch comfortably, weave in ends.

*Ruffles (Article #410) A wonderful new tape yarn with endless creative possibilities. Slip needles or hook through the stitches in the tape and watch them transform like magic into pretty rows of ruffles. 50% merino wool, 50% acrylic. Packaged in 1.50 oz./50 g (21 yd/20 m) skeins.



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
