# Free Knitting Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn Lion Brand<sup>®</sup> Lion<sup>®</sup> Wool Day-to-Night Felted Soaker

Pattern Number: BK4K-70430

**SKILL LEVEL**: Easy + (Level 3)

SIZE: Newborn

0-6 mo, 6-12 mo

Crotch depth: 16.5 (20.5) inches, before felting

Hip and waist size are adjustable.

CORRECTIONS: (applied Mar 31, 2008)

Crotch depth: 16.5 (20 20.5) inches, before felting

**SOAKER** 

Size 0-6 mos

Rows 15, 17, 19, 21: K2, kfb, knit until there are 3 stitches remaining, kfb, k2. This increases 2 stitches per row, so at row 21, you'll have 40 38 stitches.

Rows 23, 25, 27, 29, 31, 33, 35, 37, 39, 41: K2, k2tog, knit until there are 4 stitches remaining, k2tog, k2. This decreases two stitches per row, so on Row 41, you'll have 20 18 stitches.

Next row: purl

Rows 43-52: Work in stockinette stitch (knit on RS, purl on WS)

**Odd numbered Rows 53 - 83:** K2, kfb, knit until there are 3 stitches remaining, kfb, k2 (this adds 2 stitches to the row) Row 83 has 52 50 stitches.

#### **SOAKER**

Size 6-12 mos

Next 18 14 odd-numbered rows (Odd Numbered Rows 25-59 51): K2, k2tog, knit until there are 4 stitches remaining, k2tog, k2. This decreases two stitches per row, so on Row 59 51, you'll have 20 stitches.

Row <del>60</del> 52: purl

Rows 61-70 53-62: Knit in stockinette stitch (knit one row, purl the next)

**Next 22 odd-numbered rows (Rows <del>71-101</del> 63-105):** K2, kfb, knit until there are 3 stitches remaining, kfb, k2 (this adds two stitches to the row) Row <del>101</del> 105 has 64 stitches.

Row 102 106: purl

Rows 103 - 126 107-130: Knit in stockinette stitch (knit one row, purl the next)

Rows 127 - 138 131-142: Change to A, \*k2, p2 rep from \* across.

Bind off.

#### **MATERIALS**

• 820-110 <u>Lion Brand Lion</u>

Wool Yarn: Cadet Blue
1 Ball (A)

• 820-113 <u>Lion Brand Lion</u> *158 yd/144 m balls* 

Wool Yarn: Scarlet
1 Ball (B)

<u>Lion Brand Knitting</u>
 <u>Needles- Size 5 [3.75</u>
 mm]

\*Lion® Wool (Article #820). 100% Wool; package size: **Solids** 3 oz/85 g; 158 yd/144 m balls

**Prints** 2 oz/78 g; 143 yd/131 m balls



 Additional Materials Hook and loop tape

#### **GAUGE:**

22 sts x 28 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in stockinette stitch

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### **SOAKER**

Size 0-6 mos

With A, cast on 28 stitches.

Rows 1-12: \*K2, p2 rep from \* across

Row 13: Change to B. K2, kfb, knit until there are 3 stitches remaining, kfb, k2 - 30 (38) stitches

Row 14 and all even-numbered rows: purl

Rows 15, 17, 19, 21: K2, kfb, knit until there are 3 stitches remaining, kfb, k2. This increases 2 stitches per row, so at row 21, you'll have 38 stitches.

Rows 23, 25, 27, 29, 31, 33, 35, 37, 39, 41: K2, k2tog, knit until there are 4 stitches remaining, k2tog, k2. This decreases two stitches per row, so on Row 41, you'll have 18 stitches.

Next row: purl

Rows 43-52 Work in stockinette stitch (knit on RS, purl on WS)

**Odd numbered Rows 53 - 83:** K2, kfb, knit until there are 3 stitches remaining, kfb, k2 (this adds 2 stitches to the row) Row 83 has 50 stitches.

Next row: Purl

Rows 85-102: Work in stockinette stitch.

Rows 103-114: Change to A, \*k2, p2 rep from \* across.

Bind off in pattern, weave in ends.

#### **SOAKER**

Size 6-12 mos

With A, cast on 36 stitches

Rows 1-12: \*K2, p2 rep from \* across

Row 13: Change to B. K2, kfb, knit until there are 3 stitches remaining, kfb, k2 - 38 stitches

Row 14 and all even-numbered rows: purl

Rows 15, 17, 19, 21, 23: K2, kfb, knit until there are 3 stitches remaining, kfb, k2. This increases two stitches per row, so at row 23, you'll have 48 stitches.

Row 24: purl

**Next 14 odd-numbered rows (Odd Numbered Rows 25-51):** K2, k2tog, knit until there are 4 stitches remaining, k2tog, k2. This decreases two stitches per row, so on Row 51, you'll have 20 stitches.

Row 52: purl

Rows 53-62: Knit in stockinette stitch (knit one row, purl the next)

**Next 22 odd-numbered rows (Rows 63-105):** K2, kfb, knit until there are 3 stitches remaining, kfb, k2 (this adds two stitches to the row) Row 105 has 64 stitches.

**Row 106**: purl

Rows 107 - 130: Knit in stockinette stitch (knit one row, purl the next)

**Rows 131 - 142:** Change to A, \*k2, p2 rep from \* across.

Bind off.

#### FINISHING (all sizes)

Cuff

From RS, beginning at the back waistband, pick up and k stitches every row from front to back in an multiple of 4.

Row 1: \*K2, p2, repeat to end. Row 2: \*P2, k2, repeat to end. Rows 3-10: Repeat rows 1-2.

Row 11: Repeat row 1.

Bind off.

Work Cuff on remaining leg.

Weave in ends.

For Hook and loop closure: Position and sew with a sewing machine.

#### **FELTING**

Felting is a process whereby the wool is deliberately handled so that it is matted into a fabric. Wool fibers have scales and are also crimped. When these fibers are wetted and softened and then rubbed together they grab each other and are permanently bound together. This happens when you put a wool item in a washer and agitate it -- it comes out much smaller and also denser, because the fibers have bound together.

**Finished soaker size depends on how much the piece is felted.** Keep in mind that you can always felt more, but once felting is done, it is not reversible.

Wash by machine on a hot wash/cold rinse cycle with detergent and several pieces of clothing to agitate. At the end of the wash cycle measure the soaker. If you like it, stop! Place it flat to shape and let dry. If it is larger than you want, you can felt it additionally, if you dry by machine on a regular setting until almost dry. Remove from dryer and lie flat to shape.

Steam if desired.

If the soaker is still too large, you can felt it additionally by washing again. Felting is often improved by adding about 1/2 cup baking soda to the wash water to increase the alkalinity.
