Knitted in open lacy stitches, this scarf is a wonderful project for knitters looking to try their hands at lace with a project they can wear right away.

**MATERIALS**

- 5700-506 Lion Brand Martha Stewart Crafts TM/MC Cotton Hemp Yarn: Blue Icing  
2 Balls

*\*Martha Stewart Crafts<sup>TM/MC</sup> Cotton Hemp (Article #5700). 65% Cotton, 35% Hemp; package size: 1.75oz/50.00 gr. (66yds/60m) pull skeins*

- Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 8 [5 mm]
- Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch Markers
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)



**GAUGE:**

18 sts = 4 in. (10 cm) in pattern.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

**STITCH EXPLANATION:**

**sk2p (slip-k2tog-pass slipped st over)**

A double decrease worked as follows:

1. Insert right needle as if to knit, and slip the next st from the left needle to the right needle.
2. Knit the next 2 sts together.
3. With tip of left needle, lift the slipped st (the 2nd st on right needle) up and over the k2tog (first st on right needle) and off the needle - you have decreased 2 sts.

**yo (yarn over)**

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows:

1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.
2. Take yarn to back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

## NOTES:

St pattern includes increases (yarn over (yo)) to compensate for each decrease (sk2p), the st count should always remain the same. Be sure to count your sts at the end of each row!

## SCARF

Cast on 23 sts.

**Row 1 (Wrong Side):** K2, place marker (pm), p to last 2 sts, pm, k2.

**Note:** Markers are placed to define the 2 border sts at beg and at end of row. Border sts are always worked in Garter st (k every row). In following rows, slip markers each time you come to them.

**Row 2:** K3, \*yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo, k1; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2.

**Row 3:** K2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Rep Rows 2 and 3 until almost all yarn has been used.

Bind off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends.
