#### **GAUGE:**

25 sts + 32 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in St st (k on RS, p on WS) using smaller needle(s).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

#### MB (Make Bobble)

- 1. (Knit into front of next st but do not remove the st from needle, yo) twice 4 sts on right hand needle.
- 2. Knit into the same st again and remove the st from needle 4 sts increased, 5 sts on right hand needle.
- 3. Turn the work and purl the 5 sts.
- 4. Turn work, skp, k3tog.
- 5. Pass the k3tog over the skp and off the needle.

**skp** Slip 1 as if to knit, knit 1, pass slip stitch over knit stitch – 1 st decreased.

#### yo (yarn over)

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows:

- 1. Bring yarn to front of work, between the needles.
- 2. Take yarn to back of work, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

#### **PATTERN STITCHES**

Garter Rib (worked in the rnd over a multiple of 4 sts)

Rnd 1: \*K2, p2; rep from \* around.

Rnd 2: Knit.

Rep Rnds 1 and 2 for Garter Rib.

### K2, p2 Rib (worked in the rnd over a multiple of 4 sts)


Rnd 1: \*K2, p2; rep from \* to end of rnd.

Rep Rnd 1 for K2, p2 Rib worked in rnds.

#### **NOTES:**

- 1. Tunic is worked in the rnd beg at the lower edge. At armhole, piece is divided and extra rows are worked to add length to the back. Sts for sleeves are cast on and work continues in the rnd
- 2. Tunic is worked in stranded colorwork using 2 colors on each rnd. When working stranded colorwork, carry colors not in use across the WS of work. At the end of every other rnd, twist working yarn around unused colors to secure the strands.
- 3. Colorwork patterns can be worked from written instructions or by following the charts. To follow charts when working in the rnd, read all chart rnds from right to left.
- 4. When following Chart 1, work the 4 st rep around all sts on each rnd. When following Chart
- 2, work the 5 st rep around all sts on each rnd.
- 5. A larger needle is used for colorwork sections of the Tunic, to help maintain an even gauge.

- 6. When you see 'work even' in the instructions, this means to continue on in the pattern st you have established without changing the st count by increasing, decreasing, or binding off.
- 7. When you see '0' in an instruction, this means that for your specific size, there will be no sts to work. You should just skip to the next part of the instruction.



#### **BODY**

With B and smaller circular needle, cast on 144 (160) sts. Place marker for beg of rnd. Join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist sts.

Work in Garter Rib for 12 rnds.

#### Beg Colorwork Pattern 1/Chart 1

Change to larger circular needle.

Rnd 1: \*K1 with C, k3 with B; rep from \* around.

Rnd 2: \*K2 with C, k1 with B, k1 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnd 3: \*K1 with D, k3 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnds 4 and 5: \*K2 with D, k1 with C, k1 with D; rep from \* around.

Rnd 6: \*K1 with D, k3 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnd 7: \*K2 with C, k1 with A, k1 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnd 8: \*K1 with C, k3 with A; rep from \* around.

Change to smaller circular needle and A.

Work even in St st worked in rnds (k every rnd) until piece measures 3 1/2 (5 1/2) in. (9 (14) cm) from beg.

**Next Rnd:** K72 (80), place marker (pm) for side, k to end of rnd.

**Decrease Rnd:** K4, k2tog, k to 6 sts before side marker, k2tog, k4, slip marker (sm), k4, k2tog, k to 6 sts before beg of rnd marker, k2tog, k4 – 140 (156) sts at the end of this rnd.

Work in St st for 11 rnds, sl markers as you come to them.

Rep last 12 rnds 2 more times - 132 (148) sts rem.

Work even in St st until piece measures 8 (10) in. (20.5 (25.5) cm) from beg.

#### **Divide for Back and Front**

**Next Rnd:** K to 5 sts before beg of rnd marker.

**Note:** When you end before the beg of rnd marker, the piece is correctly positioned for the armhole bind offs.

**Next Rnd:** Removing markers as you work, bind off next 11 sts for armhole, k to 6 sts before side marker, bind off next 11 sts for armhole, k to end of rnd for back.

Slip first 54 (62) sts to a holder for front. Sts remaining on the needle are sts for the back. Work in St st worked back and forth in rows (k on RS, p on WS) on back sts only for 5 rows.

### **Shape Yoke (upper portion of Tunic)**

**Joining Rnd (RS):** With RS facing, k56 (64) back sts, cast on 40 (42) sts for sleeve, k54 (62) front sts, cast on 40 (42) sts for sleeve – 190 (210) sts at the end of this rnd.

Place marker for beg of rnd. Join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle.

Next 4 (8) Rnds: K56 (64), (k2, p2) 10 times, k0 (2), k54 (62), (k2, p2) 10 times, k0 (2).

#### Beg Colorwork Pattern 2/Chart 2

Change to larger circular needle.

Rnds 1 and 2: \*K1 with C, k4 with A; rep from \* around.

Rnds 3 and 4: \*K2 with C, k2 with A, k1 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnds 5 and 6: \*K1 with D, k4 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnds 7 and 8: \*K2 with D, k2 with C, k1 with D; rep from \* around.

Rnds 9 and 10: \*K2 with B, k2 with E, k1 with B; rep from \* around.

Rnds 11 and 12: \*K2 with D, k2 with C, k1 with D; rep from \* around.

Rnds 13 and 14: \*K1 with D, k4 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnd 15: \*K2 with C, k2tog with B, k1 with C; rep from \* around – 152 (168) sts at the end of this rnd.

Rnds 16 and 17: \*K1 with C, k3 with B; rep from \* around.

Rnd 18: \*K2 with B, k1 with D, k1 with B; rep from \* around.

Rnd 19: \*K1 with B, k3 with D; rep from \* around.

Rnd 20: \*K2 with D, k1 with C, k1 with D; rep from \* around.

Rnds 21 and 22: \*K1 with D, k3 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnd 23: \*K2 with D, k1 with C, k1 with D; rep from \* around.

Rnd 24: \*With D, k2tog, k2; rep from \* around – 114 (126) sts at the end of this rnd.

Rnd 25: With D, knit, changing to larger double pointed needles (dpn) as follows: With each of 2 dpns,

k28 (31) sts from circular needle, with each of 2 remaining dpns, k 29 (32) sts from circular needle.

Rnd 26: \*K1 with D, k2 with B; rep from \* around.

Rnd 27: \*K1 with E, k2 with B; rep from \* around.

Rnd 28: \*K1 with E, k2 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnd 29: \*MB with E, k2 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnds 30 and 31: \*K1 with E, k2 with C; rep from \* around.

Rnd 32: \*K1 with E, k2tog with C; rep from \* around – 76 (84) sts at the end of this rnd.


Rnd 33: \*K1 with A, k1 with C; rep from \* around.

Change to smaller double pointed needles and A. Be sure to move your marker as well! Work in K2, p2 Rib for 5 rnds.

Bind off.

#### **FINISHING**

Weave in ends.
