

# Free Knit & Crochet Pattern Lion Brand<sup>®</sup> Wool-Ease<sup>®</sup> Thick & Quick<sup>®</sup> Buttoned Bandanna Cowl

## Free Knit & Crochet Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn Lion Brand® Wool-Ease® Thick & Quick® Buttoned Bandanna Cowl

SKILL LEVEL: Easy

SIZE:

Finished Circumference About 26 in. (66 cm)

CORRECTIONS: (applied Mar 29, 2012)

#### NOTES

1. Cowl is worked from the bandanna point up. The straight side edges are seamed to form a tube.

## **MATERIALS**

- 640-503 Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick Yarn: Granite
  - 2 Balls
- Lion Brand Size 13 [9 mm] 29-inch [75 cm] Circular Knitting Needles
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook Size N-13 (9 mm)
- Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
- Additional Materials
   Four buttons 7/8 in. (23 mm) diameter
   Sewing needle and thread

## GAUGE:

9 sts = 4 in. (10 cm) in St st (k on RS, p on WS). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

### STITCH EXPLANATION:

**M1 (make 1)** An increase worked by lifting the horizontal thread lying between needles and placing it onto left needle. Knit this new stitch through the back loop - 1 st increased.

**kfb (knit in front and back)** Knit next st without removing it from left needle, then k through back of same st - 1 st increased.

**pfb (purl into front and back)** Purl next st without removing it from left needle, then p through back of same st - 1 st increased.

#### NOTES:

- 1. Cowl is worked from the bandanna point up.
- 2. Circular needle is used to accommodate the bulky sts. Work back and forth in rows on circular needle as if working on straight needles.
- 3. Buttonholes are worked with a crochet hook when Cowl has been completed.



## COWL

Cast on 1 st.

Row 1 (RS): Kfb - 2 sts at the end of this row.

Row 2: P1, pfb - 3 sts.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: K1, \*M1, k1; rep from \* to end of row - 5 sts.

Row 6 and all WS Rows: Purl.

**Row 7:** K1, M1, k to last st, M1, k1 - 7 sts.

Rep last 2 rows until there are 35 sts. End with a RS row. Note: End with a RS row means that the last row you work should be a RS row and the next row that you are ready to work will be a WS row. Bandanna triangle is now complete.

Next Row (cast-on row): P to end of row, cast on 11 sts - 46 sts.

Next Row (cast-on row): K to end of row, cast on 11 sts - 57 sts at the end of this row.

Continue in St st (k on RS, p on WS) until straight sides measure about 8 in. (20.5 cm) from cast-on rows. Bind off, leaving last st on needle. Do not cut yarn.

## **FINISHING**

Insert crochet hook into last st, ch 1, working evenly across straight side edge of Cowl, sc in beginning of side edge, \*ch 2, skip next 3/4 in. (2 cm), work 3 sc evenly spaced over next 1 1/4 in. (3 cm); rep from \* 3 more times (to make 4 buttonholes), sc evenly spaced to end of straight side edge. Fasten off. With sewing needle and thread, sew buttons to other straight side edge of Cowl, opposite buttonholes. Weave in ends.
