SKILL LEVEL: Advanced Intermediate

SIZE: Child (Multiple Sizes)

12-18 months (18-24 months, 2-4 years)

Finished Chest 23 1/2 (25 1/2, 28) in. (59.5 (65, 71) cm), buttoned

Finished Length 10 (11, 12) in. (25.5 (28, 30.5) cm)

CORRECTIONS: (applied Aug 9, 2013)

Hood Schematic corrected.

HOOD

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Divide for Front Opening

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Decrease Row: Sl 1, k2tog, knit to end of first side (front edge), with 2nd ball of yarn, knit across sts of 2nd side to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 (neck edge) - 49 (51, 53) sts rem on each side.

~~**Next Row:** Knit across sts of first side, with 2nd ball of yarn, knit across sts of 2nd side.~~

Rep last 2 rows **Decrease Row** 45 (47, 49) more times - 4 sts rem on each side.

MATERIALS

- 881-206 Lion Brand Jamie Yarn:
Mardi Gras Stripes
5 6, 7 Balls

- Lion Brand Knitting Needles-
Size 6 [4.00 mm]

- Lion Brand Stitch Holders

- Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch
Markers

- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt
Needles (Set of 6)

- Additional Materials

Circular knitting needle size 6
(4.25 mm), 36 in. (91.5 cm) long

Four buttons, about 1/2 in. (12
mm) diameter

**Jamie® (Article #881). 100% Acrylic; package
size: **Solids:** 1.75 oz (50 g), 137 yd (125 m)
Stripes: 1.4 oz (40 g), 109 yd (100 m)*



GAUGE:

20 sts + 40 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter st (k every row).

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

STITCH EXPLANATION:

kfb (knit in front and back) Knit next st without removing it from left needle, then k through back of same st – 1 st increased.

NOTES:

1. Jacket is made from 8 pieces; Back, 2 Fronts, 2 Pocket Linings, 2 Sleeves, and Hood.
2. The Back and Sleeves are worked beg at lower edge.
3. The Fronts and Pocket Linings are worked diagonally, beg at lower front corner.
4. Hood is worked diagonally, beg at peak of Hood.
5. Front edging is worked with a circular needle to accommodate the large number of sts.
6. Because the direction of knitting varies throughout this pattern, schematics have been labeled with the cast on edge and the direction of knitting. Refer to the schematics as you work each piece to clarify the shaping.

BACK

Cast on 60 (66, 72) sts.

Work in Garter st (k every row) until piece measures 10 (11, 12) in. (25.5 (28, 30.5) cm) from beg. Bind off.

POCKET LININGS (make 2) Cast on 3 sts.

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1, (k1, yo, k1) in next st, k1 - 5 sts at the end of this row.

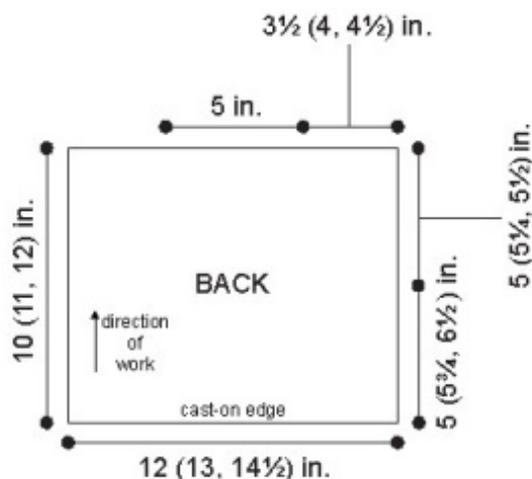
Row 2: Knit.

Row 3 (Increase Row): Sl 1, kfb, knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1 - 7 sts.

Rep last 2 rows 14 more times - 35 sts when all increases have been completed.

Last Row (WS): Bind off 10 sts, k 15, bind off last 10 sts - 15 sts rem.

Sl rem sts to a holder.



LEFT FRONT

Cast on 3 sts.

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1, (k1, yo, k1) in next st, k1 - 5 sts at the end of this row.

Row 2: Knit.

Row 3 (Increase Row): Sl 1, kfb (this is the lower edge), knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1 (this is the front edge) - 7 sts.

Rep last 2 rows 14 more times - 35 sts when all increases have been completed.

Next Row (WS): Knit.

Pocket Joining Row (RS): Sl 1, kfb, k8, sl next 15 sts to a holder for pocket edging, k15 Pocket Lining sts from holder, k8, kfb, k1 - 37 sts.

Next Row: Knit.

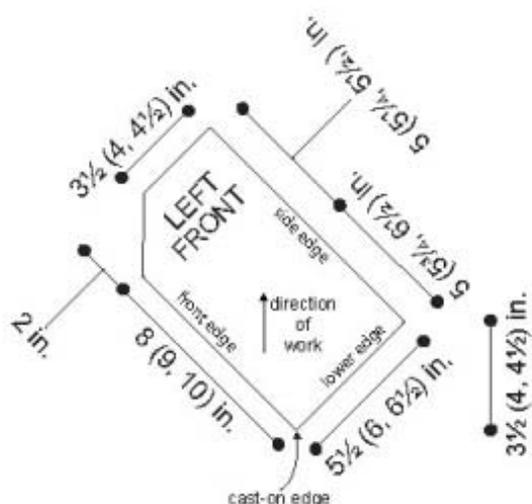
Increase Row: Sl 1, kfb, knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1 - 39 sts.

Rep last 2 rows 1 (3, 5) more times - 41 (45, 49) sts when all increases have been completed.

Next Row (WS): Knit.

Next Row (RS): Sl 1, k2tog (corner made this is now the side edge), knit to last 2 sts, kfb (front edge), k1 - 41 (45, 49) sts.

Rep last 2 rows until front edge measures 8 (9, 10) in. (20.5 (23, 25.5) cm), end with a WS row. **Note:** End with a WS row means that the last row you work should be a WS row, and the next row that you are ready to work will be a RS row.



Shape Neck

Note: The neck is shaped by continuing to decrease on the side edge without working the compensating increases on the neck edge.

Next Row (RS): Sl 1, k2tog (side edge), knit to end of row (neck edge) - 40 (44, 48) sts.

Next Row: Knit.

Rep last 2 rows until side edge measures 6 1/2 (7, 7 1/2) in. (16.5 (18, 19) cm), end with a WS row.

Shape Shoulder

Next Row (RS): Sl 1, k2tog (side edge), knit to last 3 sts (shoulder edge), k2tog, k1.

Next Row: Knit.

Rep last 2 rows until 5 sts rem.

Last Row: Sl 1, k3tog, k1 - 3 sts.

Bind off.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 3 sts.

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1, (k1, yo, k1) in next st, k1 - 5 sts.

Row 2: Knit.

Row 3 (Increase Row): Sl 1, kfb (this is the front edge), knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1 (this is the lower edge) - 7 sts.

Rep last 2 rows 14 more times - 35 sts when all increases have been completed.

Next Row (WS): Knit.

Pocket Joining Row (RS): Sl 1, kfb, k8, sl next 15 sts to a holder for pocket edging, k15 Pocket Lining sts from holder, k8, kfb, k1 - 37 sts.

Next Row: Knit.

Increase Row: Sl 1, kfb, knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1 - 39 sts.

Rep last 2 rows 1 (3, 5) more times - 41 (45, 49) sts when all increases have been completed.

Next Row (WS): Knit.

Next Row (RS): Sl 1, kfb (front edge), knit to last 3 sts, k2tog (lower corner made this is now the side edge), k1 - 41 (45, 49) sts.

Rep last 2 rows until front edge measures 8 (9, 10) in. (20.5 (23, 25.5) cm), end with a WS row.

Shape Neck

Note: The neck is shaped by continuing to decrease on the side edge without working the compensating increases on the neck edge.

Next Row (RS): Sl 1, (neck edge), knit to last 3 sts (side edge), k2tog, k1 - 40 (44, 48) sts at the end of this row.

Next Row: Knit.

Rep last 2 rows until side edge measures 6 1/2 (7, 7 1/2) in. (16.5 (18, 19) cm), end with a WS row.

Shape Shoulder

Next Row (RS): Sl 1, k2tog (shoulder edge), knit to last 3 sts (side edge), k2tog, k1.

Next Row: Knit.

Rep last 2 rows until 5 sts rem.

Last Row: Sl 1, k3tog, k1 - 3 sts.

Bind off.

SLEEVES (make 2)

Cast on 34 (36, 38) sts.

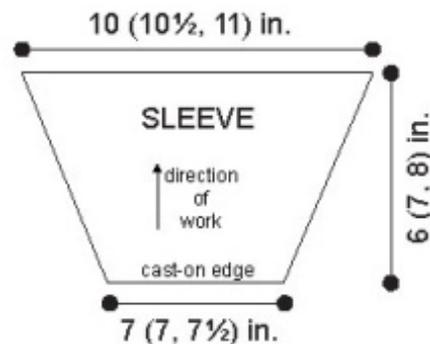
Knit 5 rows.

Increase Row: K1, kfb, knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1 - 36 (38, 40) sts.

Rep last 6 rows 7 more times - 50 (52, 54) sts when all increases have been completed.

Work in Garter st until piece measures 6 (7, 8) in. (15 (18, 20.5) cm) from beg, end with a WS row.

Bind off.



HOOD

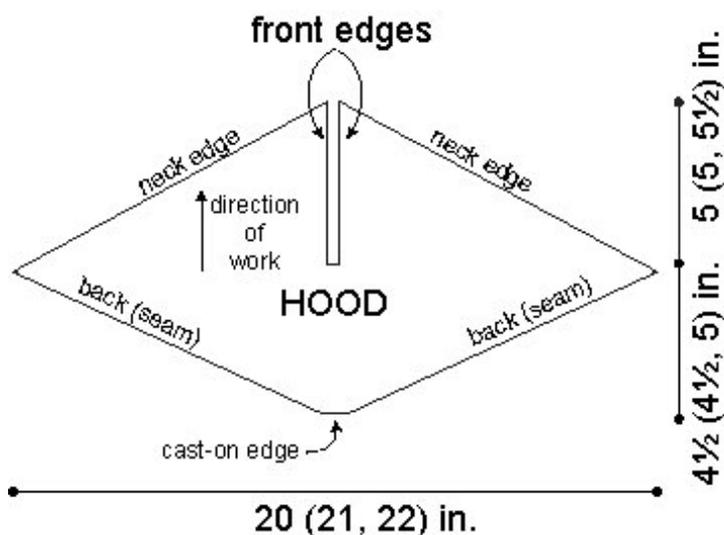
Beg at peak of Hood, cast on 5 sts.

Row 1 (RS): K1, (k1, yo, k1) in next st, pm (place marker), k1, pm, (k1, yo, k1) in next st, k1 - 9 sts.

Row 2: Knit.

Increase Row: (back seam edge) K1, kfb, knit to 1 st before marker, kfb, slip marker (sm), k1, sm, kfb, knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1 (back seam edge) - 13 sts.

Rep last 2 rows 22 (23, 24) more times - 101 (105, 109) sts when all increases have been completed.



Divide for Front Opening

Next Row (WS): K50 (52, 54) sts, join a 2nd ball of yarn and bind off 1 st (center front st), knit to end of row.

Decrease Row: Sl 1, k2tog, knit to end of first side (front edge), with 2nd ball of yarn, knit across sts of 2nd side to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 (corner made, this is now the neck edge) - 49 (51, 53) sts rem on each side.

Rep Decrease Row 45 (47, 49) more times - 4 sts rem on each side.

Next Row (RS): (K1, k2tog, k1) on each side - 3 sts rem on each side.

Last Row: (K3tog) on each side. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew edges of Pocket Linings to WS of Fronts. Sew shoulder seams. Place markers 5 (5 1/4, 5 1/2) in. (12.5 (13.5, 14) cm) down from shoulders on Front and Back. Sew top of one Sleeve between markers. Rep to sew in other Sleeve. Sew side and Sleeve seams.

Sew back seam of Hood closed. Sew neck edge of Hood to neck edge of Jacket.

Pocket Edging

With RS facing, k15 pocket edging sts from holder.

Work in Garter st for 5 rows.

Bind off.

Rep for opposite pocket edging.

Front Edging

Note: Circular needle is used to accommodate the large number of sts. Work back and forth in rows on circular needle as if working on straight needles.

Place markers for 4 buttons evenly spaced along one front edge (most usually, buttons are sewn to the Left Front edge for girls and to the Right Front edge for boys), with first marker 1 in. (2.5 cm) from lower edge and last at beg of neck shaping.

With RS facing and circular needle, join yarn at lower corner of Right Front, pick up and k79 (88, 97) sts evenly spaced along Right Front edge and right front edge of Hood to center front st, pick up and k79 (88, 97) sts evenly spaced along left front edge of Hood and Left Front edge to lower corner - 158 (176, 194) sts at the end of this row.

Next Row: Knit.

Buttonhole Row: *Knit to marker for button, yo, k2tog(for buttonhole); rep from * 3 more times, knit to end of row.

Knit 2 rows.

Bind off.

Sew buttons opposite buttonholes.

Weave in ends.
