This easy but intricate-looking cowl is great for those who want to try cabling for the first time.

SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: One Size

Finished Circumference About 24 in. (61cm) Finished Height About 13 1/2 in. (34.5 cm)

CORRECTIONS: (applied Oct 14, 2013)

COWL

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Row 8: K1, *K6, sl next 3 sts

MATERIALS

136-149 <u>Lion Brand</u>
 <u>Heartland Yarn: Great</u>

 <u>Smoky Mountains</u>
 2 Balls

 Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 9 [5.5 mm]

<u>Lion Brand Cable</u>
 Needles (Set of 2)

<u>Lion Brand Large-Eye</u>
 <u>Blunt Needles (Set of 6)</u>

*<u>Heartland</u> (Article #136). 100% Acrylic; package size: 5.00oz/142.00 gr. (251yds/230m) pull skeins



GAUGE:

21 sts and 19 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) over pattern stitch.

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

NOTES:

Cowl is knit flat then seamed to form a tube.

COWL

Cast on 74 sts.

Row 1 and all WS Rows: K1, p to last st, k1.

Row 2 (RS): Knit.

Row 4: K1, *sl next 3 sts to cable needle and hold in front of work, k3, k3 from cable needle, k6; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 6: Knit.

Row 8: K1, *k6, sl next 3 sts to cable needle and hold in back of work, k3, k3 from cable needle; rep

from* to last st, k1.

Rep Rows 1-8 until piece measures about 24 in. (61 cm) from beg, ending with a Row 7. **Note:** End with a Row 7 means that the last row worked should be a Row 7. Bind off.

FINISHING

Matching cast on end to bind off end, seam Cowl to form tube. Weave in ends.
