# Free Knitting Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn

## Lion Brand® Heartland

### Lively Hat

Pattern Number: L30102

**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy (Level 2)

**SIZE:** One Size

**Finished Circumference** About 16 in. (40.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of adult sizes

**CORRECTIONS:** (applied Dec 20, 2013)

#### Notes

1. Hat is worked in rnds from lower edge up to crown (top of Hat) **with 2 strands of yarn held together.**
2. ~~The Hat begins on a circular needle, changing to double pointed needles when decreasing at the crown. If you prefer, Hat may be worked entirely on double pointed needles.~~ **Wind yarn into 2 separate balls before beginning.**
3. ~~When knitting in the round on double pointed needles (dpns), your sts need to be divided fairly evenly onto the needles. If you are working with a set of 4 dpn, your sts should be divided among 3 needles. The total number of sts will not always be evenly divisible by the number of dpns that you are using – this is not a problem! Simply divide your sts as evenly as possible, you will still create a symmetrical 'tube' of knitting.~~ **The Hat begins on a circular needle, changing to double pointed needles when decreasing at the crown. If you prefer, Hat may be worked entirely on double pointed needles.**

#### HAT

**Rnd 2:** (K2tog, p2tog) 5 times, k2tog - 11 sts at the end of this rnd.

Cut yarn, leaving a ~~long yarn tail~~ **long tails**. Thread tails through remaining sts and pull to gather.

#### MATERIALS

- 136-113 Lion Brand Heartland Yarn: Redwood  
1 Ball
- Brittany Birchwood Double Pointed Needles - Size 13
- Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch Markers
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
- Additional Materials  
Circular knitting needle size 13 (9 mm), 16 in. (40.5 cm) long

*\*Heartland (Article #136). 100% Acrylic;  
package size: 5.00oz/142.00 gr.  
(251yds/230m) pull skeins*



#### GAUGE:

11 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over pattern.

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will

be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### NOTES:

1. Hat is worked in rnds from lower edge up to crown (top of Hat) with 2 strands of yarn held together.
2. Wind yarn into 2 separate balls before beginning.
3. The Hat begins on a circular needle, changing to double pointed needles when decreasing at the crown. If you prefer, Hat may be worked entirely on double pointed needles.

#### HAT

With circular knitting needle, cast on 44 sts. Place marker for beg of rnd. Join by working the first st on left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist sts.

**Rnd 1:** \*K3, p1; rep from \* to end of round.

**Rnd 2:** P1, \*k1, p3; rep from \* to last 3 sts, k1, p2.

Rep Rnds 1 and 2 until piece measures about 8 in. (20.5 cm) from beg.

#### Shape Crown (top of Hat)

**Rnd 1:** Work rnd and change to double-pointed needles (dpn) as follows: With first and second dpn, (k2tog, p2tog) 4 times from circular needle; with third dpn, (k2tog, p2tog) 3 times from circular needle - 22 sts at the end of this rnd.

**Rnd 2:** (K2tog, p2tog) 5 times, k2tog - 11 sts at the end of this rnd.

Cut yarn, leaving long tails. Thread tails through remaining sts and pull to gather. Knot securely.

#### FINISHING

Weave in ends.
