#### **MATERIALS**

- 831-148 <u>Lion Brand Kitchen</u> <u>Cotton Yarn: Tropic Breeze</u> 1 Ball
- <u>Lion Brand Crochet Hook -</u> <u>Size J-10 (6 mm)</u>
- <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt</u>
   Needles (Set of 6)

\*Kitchen Cotton (Article #831). 100% Cotton; package size: 2.00oz/57.00 gr. (99yds/90m) pull skeins



## GAUGE:

Exact gauge is not essential to this project.

## STITCH EXPLANATION:

#### **TECHNIQUE EXPLANATION**

This design begins by working an adjustable ring to create a neat, closed center on the finished Washcloth.

**Adjustable ring method:** Wrap yarn around index finger. Insert hook into ring on finger, yarn over and draw up a loop. Carefully slip ring from finger and work the stitches of Rnd 1 (in pattern, below) into the ring. When Rnd 1 is complete gently, but firmly, pull tail to close up the ring.

# NOTES:

Do NOT turn at the end of rnds.

# **WASHCLOTH**

Following the Technique Explanation above, make an adjustable ring.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout the pattern), dc in ring, ch 1, (2 dc in ring, ch 1) 5 times; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 12 dc and 6 ch-1 sps at the end of this rnd.

Rnd 2: SI st in each st to first ch-1 sp, (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in first ch-1 sp, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in each ch-1 sp around; join with sI st in top of beg ch - 24 dc, and 6 ch-1 sps at the end of this rnd.

Rnd 3: SI st in each st to first ch-1 sp, (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in first ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc, \*(2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc; rep from \* around; join with sI st in top of beg ch.

Rnd 4: SI st in each st to first ch-1 sp, (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in first ch-1 sp, dc in next 2 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 2 dc, \*(2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in next ch-1 sp, dc in next 2 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 2 dc; rep from \* around; join with sI st in top of beg ch.

Rnd 5: SI st in each st to first ch-1 sp, (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in first ch-1 sp, dc in next 3 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, \*(2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in next ch-1 sp, dc in next 3 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc; rep from \* around; join with sI st in top of beg ch.

Rnd 6: SI st in each st to first ch-1 sp, (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in first ch-1 sp, dc in next 4 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 4 dc, \*(2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in next ch-1 sp, dc in next 4 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 4 dc; rep from \* around; join with sI st in top of beg ch.

Rnd 7: SI st in each st to first ch-1 sp, (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in first ch-1 sp, dc in next 5 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 5 dc, \*(2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in next ch-1 sp, dc in next 5 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 5 dc; rep from \* around; join with sI st in top of beg ch.

Rnd 8: SI st in each st to first ch-1 sp, (sI st, ch 1, 3 sc) in first ch-1 sp, sc in next 6 dc, sk next 2 dc, sc in next 6 dc, sk next 2 dc, sc in next 6 dc, sk next 2 dc, sc in next 6 dc, sk next 2 dc, sc in next 6 dc; rep from \* around; join with sI st in first sc.

Fasten off.

# **FINISHING**

Weave in ends.
