## GAUGE:

14 sts +20 rows $=$ about $4 \mathrm{in} .(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ in pattern, with 2 strands held tog.
When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for
in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

## Making a Gauge Swatch

## STITCH EXPLANATI ON:

kfb (knit in front and back) Knit next st without removing it from left needle, then $k$ through back of same st - 1 st increased.

## NOTES:

1. Wrap is worked back and forth in rows beg at neck/front edge, with 2 strands of yarn held tog.
2. Circular needle is used to accommodate the large number of sts. Work back and forth in rows on circular needle as if working with straight needles.
3. Sleeves are worked in rnds.

## WRAP

With larger needle and 2 strands of A held tog, cast on 318 sts.
Place a marker following the 133 rd st, place a 2 nd marker after the next 14 sts, place a 3rd marker after the next 24 sts, and place a 4th marker after the next 14 sts. There should be 133 sts following the 4th marker.
Row 1 (RS): K1, k2tog, k1, (*p1, k1; rep from * to 1 st before next marker, kfb, slip marker (sm), kfb) 4 times, p1, **k1, p1; rep from ** to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 - 324 sts.
Row 2: K1, k2tog, *k1, p1; rep from * to last 3 sts slipping markers as you come to them, k2tog, k1 322 sts.
Row 3: K1, k2tog, (*k1, p1; rep from * to 1 st before next marker, kfb, sm, kfb) 4 times, **k1, p1; rep from ${ }^{* *}$ to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 - 328 sts.
Rows 4 and 5: Rep Rows 2 and $3-332$ sts.
Row 6: Rep Row 2 - 330 sts.
Change to 2 strands of $D$ held tog.
Row 7: With 2 strands of $D$ held tog, $k 1, k 2$ tog, ( $k$ to 1 st before next marker, $k f b, s m, k f b$ ) 4 times, $k$ to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1-336 sts.
Row 8: K1, k2tog, p to last 3 sts slipping markers as you come to them, k2tog, k1 - 334 sts.
Rows 9 and 10: Rep last 2 rows - 338 sts.
Change to 1 strand each of $C$ and $D$ held tog.
Row 11: With 1 strand each of $C$ and $D$ held tog, $k 1, k 2$ tog, ( $k$ to 1 st before next marker, $k f b, s m, k f b) 4$ times, $k$ to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 - 344 sts.
Rows 12-14: Rep Rows 2-4-346 sts.
Change to 2 strands of $C$ held tog.
Rows 15-18: With 2 strands of $C$ held tog, rep Rows 7-10-354 sts.
Change to 2 strands of $B$ held tog.
Rows 19-22: With 2 strands of $B$ held tog, rep Rows 11-14-362 sts.
Change to 1 strand each of $A$ and $B$ held tog.
Rows 23 and 24: With 1 strand each of $A$ and $B$ held tog, rep Rows 7 and 8.
Change to 2 strands of A held tog.
Rows 25-48: With 2 strands of A held tog, rep Rows 1-24.
Rows 49 and 50: Rep Rows 1 and 2 - 418 sts.
Note: You should have 108 sts before first marker, 64 sts between first and 2nd markers, 74 sts between 2nd and 3rd markers, 64 sts between 3rd and 4th markers, and 108 sts following 4th marker.

## Divide for Sleeves

Change to 2 strands of $D$ held tog.

Note: Sts for sleeves are now placed on holders to be worked later for sleeves. Use 2 holders for each set of sleeve sts, placing one half of the sleeve sts on each holder, or use a length of scrap yarn to hold sts.
Row 51 (RS): With 2 strands of $D$ held tog, k1, k2tog, $k$ to first marker, remove first marker, place all sts between first and 2 nd markers on holders for first sleeve, remove $2 n d$ marker, $k$ to 3 rd marker, remove 3 rd marker, place all sts between 3rd and 4th markers on holders for 2 nd sleeve, remove 4th marker, $k$ to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 - 288 sts remain on needle.
Rows 52-54: K1, k2tog, *k1, p1; rep from * to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 - 282 sts.
Change to 1 strand each of $C$ and $D$ held tog.
Rows 55-58: With 1 strand each of $C$ and $D$ held tog, $k 1, k 2 t o g, * k 1$, 1 ; rep from * to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 - 274 sts.
Bind off.

## Sleeves

Place sts for first sleeve on smaller needle ready to work a RS rnd. Place marker for beg of rnd. Join by working the first st on left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle - 64 sts.
Rnds 1-6: With 2 strands of $B$ held tog, *K1, p1; rep from * to end of rnd.
Bind off.
Rep for 2nd sleeve.
FINISHI NG
Weave in ends.
