MATERIALS

- 136-149 Lion Brand Heartland Yarn: Great Smoky Mountains
4 Balls
 - Boye Aluminum Circular Knitting Needles 36 inches Size 08
 - Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch Markers
 - Lion Brand Cable Needles (Set of 2)
 - Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
 - Additional Materials
Sewing needle and thread
4 buttons, 1 in. (25 mm) diameter
- *Heartland (Article #136). 100% Acrylic; package size: 5.00oz/142.00 gr. (251yds/230m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

30 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Cable Panel B.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

4 / 4 LC (4 over 4 left cross) Slip 4 sts to cable needle and hold in front, k4, then k4 from cable needle.

One-Row Buttonhole

1. Bring yarn to front and sl next st as if to p. Take yarn to back.
2. *Sl next st from left hand needle to right hand needle, and pass first sl st over it; rep from * 3 more times.
3. Sl last bound-off st back to left needle and turn work.

4. Cast on 5 sts as follows: *insert right needle between the first and second sts on left needle, yarn over (to make a new st), sl this new st onto the left hand needle; rep from * 4 times more, turn work.
5. With yarn in back, sl first st from left hand needle to right needle, pass last cast on st over to stabilize the buttonhole.

PATTERN STITCHES

K1, p1 Rib (worked over an odd number of sts)

Row 1 (RS): K1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end of row.

Row 2: K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Rep Row 2 for K1, p1 Rib.

Seed St (worked over an even number of sts)

Row 1 (RS): *K1, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 2: K the purl sts and p the knit sts.

Rep Row 2 for Seed st.

Cable Panel A (worked over 20 sts)

Row 1 (RS): P1, k3, p2, k8, p2, k3, p1.

Row 2: K1, p3, k2, p8, k2, p3, k1.

Rows 3 and 4: Rep Rows 1 and 2.

Row 5: P1, k3, p2, 4/4 LC, p2, k3, p1.

Row 6: Rep Row 2.

Rows 7-10: Rep Rows 1 and 2 twice.

Rep Rows 1-10 for Cable Panel A.

Cable Panel B (worked over 30 sts)

Row 1 (RS): P1, k3, p2, (k8, p2) twice, k3, p1.

Row 2: K1, p3, (k2, p8) twice, k2, p3, k1.

Rows 3 and 4: Rep Rows 1 and 2.

Row 5: P1, k3, p2, (4/4 LC, p2) twice, k3, p1.

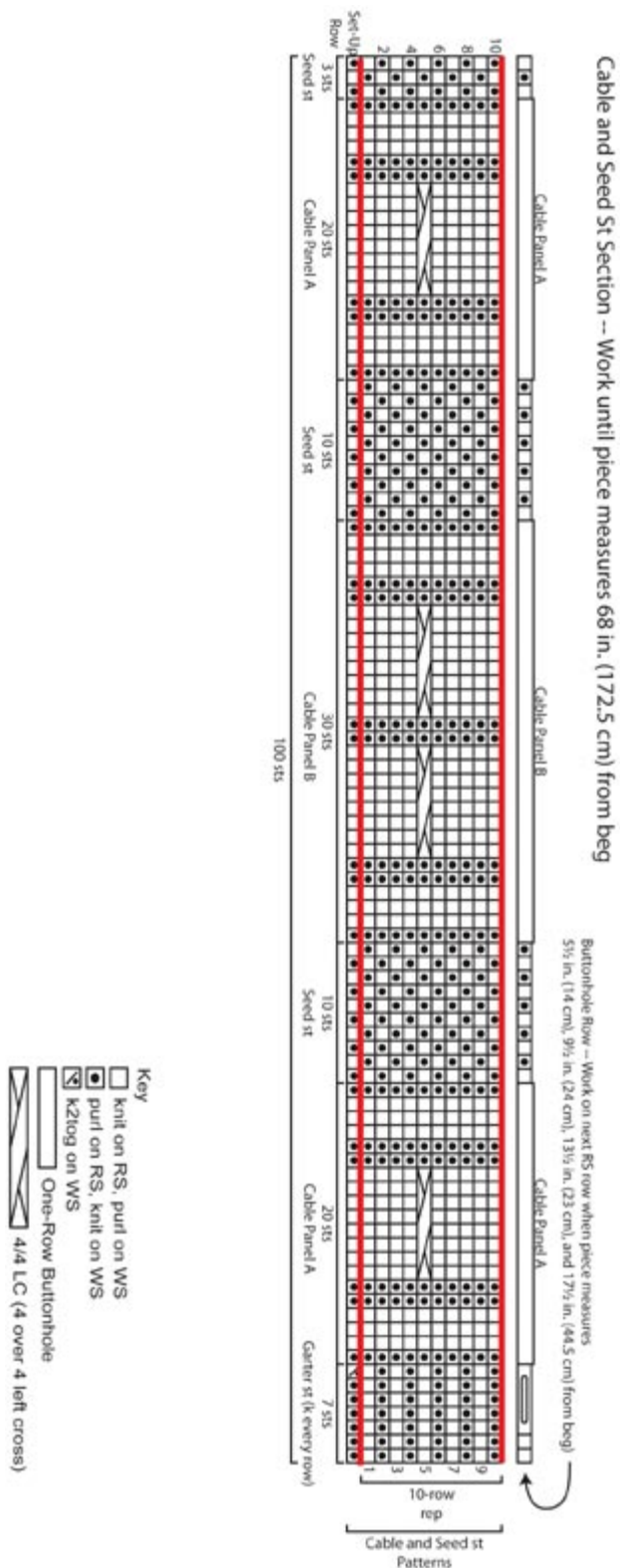
Row 6: Rep Row 2.

Rows 7-10: Rep Rows 1 and 2 twice.

Rep Rows 1-10 for Cable Panel B.

NOTES:

1. Wrap, including borders, is worked in one piece following written instructions or by following a chart.
2. When working from chart, read RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right.
3. The Set-Up Row is worked only once. Rows 1-10 on the chart are rep for the length of the Wrap.
4. Pattern sts are separated by markers for ease in working.
5. A circular needle is used to accommodate the large number of sts. Work back and forth in rows on circular needle as if working on straight needles.



WRAP

Cast on 101 sts.

Beginning Border

Work in K1, p1 Rib for 9 rows.

Cable and Seed St Pattern Section

Set-Up Row (WS): K1, p1, k1 (for Seed st), place marker (pm), k1, p3, k2, p8, k2, p3, k1 (for Cable Panel A), pm, (p1, k1) 5 times (for Seed st), pm, k1, p3, (k2, p8) twice, k2, p3, k1 (for Cable Panel B), pm, (p1, k1) 5 times (for Seed st), pm, k1, p3, k2, p8, k2, p3, k1 (for Cable Panel A), pm, k2tog, k to end

of row (for Garter st (k every row) border) – 100 sts.

Row 1 (RS): Work in Garter st to first marker, sm (slip marker), work Row 1 of Cable Panel A, sm, work Row 1 of Seed st to next marker, sm, work Row 1 of Cable Panel B, sm, work Row 1 of Seed st to next marker, sm, work Row 1 of Cable Panel A, sm, k1, p1, k1 (for Seed st).

Row 2 (WS): Work next row of Seed st to first marker, sm, work next row of Cable Panel A, sm, work next row of Seed st to next marker, sm, work next row of Cable Panel B, sm, work next row of Seed st to next marker, sm, work next row of Cable Panel A, sm, work in Garter st to end of row.

Row 3: Work in Garter st to first marker, sm, work next row of Cable Panel A, sm, work in Seed st to next marker, sm, work next row of Cable Panel B, sm, work in Seed st to next marker, sm, work next row of Cable Panel A, sm, work in Seed st to end of row.

Rep Rows 2 and 3 until piece measures about 5 1/2 in. (14 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Buttonhole Row (RS): K2, work One-Row Buttonhole, sm, work next row of Cable Panel A, sm, work in Seed st to next marker, sm, work next row of Cable Panel B, sm, work in Seed st to next marker, sm, work next row of Cable Panel A, sm, work in Seed st to end of row.

Work in patterns as established until piece measures about 9 1/2 in. (24 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Rep Buttonhole Row.

Work in patterns as established until piece measures about 13 1/2 in. (34.5 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Rep Buttonhole Row.

Work in patterns as established until piece measures about 17 1/2 in. (44.5 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Rep Buttonhole Row.

Work in patterns as established until piece measures about 68 in. (172.5 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Ending Border

Note: Remove all markers as you work the next row.

Row 1 (RS): Work Row 1 of K1, p1 Rib over first 5 sts, p into front and then k into back of next st, beg with a p1 continue in K1, p1 Rib to end of row – 101 sts at the end of this row.

Rows 2-9: Work in K1, p1 Rib to end of row.

Bind off in rib.

FINISHING

With sewing needle and thread and following diagram, sew buttons to Wrap, matching placement of buttonholes.

Weave in ends.
