SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: One Size

Finished Circumference About 6 1/2 in. (16.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes.

Finished Length About 12 1/2 in. (32 cm)

 1 Ball (A)
- 924-148 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Modern Baby:</u> <u>Turquoise</u>

 1 Ball (B)
- <u>Lion Brand Knitting</u>
 <u>Needles- Size 5 [3.75 mm]</u>
- <u>Lion Brand Knitting</u>
 <u>Needles- Size 6 [4.00</u>
 mm]
- <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye</u>
 <u>Blunt Needles (Set of</u>

*Modern Baby (Article #924). 50% Acrylic, 50% Nylon; package size: 2.60oz/75.00 gr. (173yds/158m) pull skeins



GAUGE:

22 sts + 30 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in St st (k on RS, p on W) with larger needles.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

PATTERN STITCH

K1, p1 Rib (worked over an odd number of sts)
Row 1 (RS): K1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end of row.

Row 2: K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Rep Row 2 for K1, p1 Rib.

NOTES:

- 1. Leg Warmers are made in a set of 3, each in a different stripe pattern, to provide multiple mix and match options.
- 2. Leg Warmers are worked back and forth in rows and then seamed.

LEG WARMER A

With smaller needles and A, cast on 37 sts.

With A, work in K1, p1 Rib for 8 rows.

Change to larger needles.

With A, beg with a RS (knit) row, work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) for 2 rows.

With B, work in St st for 2 rows.

With A, work in St st for 10 rows.

Rep last 12 rows 5 more times.

With B, work in St st for 2 rows.

With A, work in St st for 2 rows.

Change to smaller needles.

With A, work in K1, p1 Rib for 8 rows.

Bind off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

LEG WARMER B

With smaller needles and B, cast on 37 sts.

With B, work in K1, p1 Rib for 8 rows.

Change to larger needles.

With B, beg with a RS (knit) row, work in St st for 2 rows.

With A, work in St st for 2 rows.

With B, work in St st for 10 rows.

Rep last 12 rows 5 more times.

With A, work in St st for 2 rows.

With B, work in St st for 2 rows.

Change to smaller needles.

With B, work in K1, p1 Rib for 8 rows.

Bind off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

LEG WARMER C

With smaller needles and A, cast on 37 sts.

With A, work in K1, p1 Rib for 8 rows.

Change to larger needles.

With A, beg with a RS (knit) row, work in St st for 4 rows.

With B, work in St st for 10 rows.

With A, work in St st for 10 rows.

Rep last 20 rows 2 more times.

With B, work in St st for 10 rows.

With A, work in St st for 4 rows.

Change to smaller needles.

With A, work in K1, p1 Rib for 8 rows.

Bind off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

FINISHING

With yarn tail, sew sides of each Leg Warmer together.

Weave in ends.
