MATERIALS


LION BRAND® LION'S PRIDE® WOOLSPUN® (Art. #671) #129 Mahogany 1 ball (A) #153 Black 1 ball (B) #173 Avocado 1 ball (C) or colors of your choice
LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle

ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

• Circular knitting needle size 10.5 (6.5 mm), 48 in. (123 cm) long

SIZE

About 7 x 60 in. (18 x 152.5 cm)



GAUGE

12 sts + 26 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 1-4 of Step 2. **BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.**

NOTES

- 1. Scarf is worked lengthwise, back and forth in rows, changing pattern sts and colors.
- 2. To start working with a new color, just drop the old color and begin working with the new color. For security, you can knot the ends of both colors together, then untie these knots when you finish the Scarf. Don't cut the yarn between color changes. Instead, just carry it along the side edge of the Scarf until you need it again.
- 3. To change color, just drop the old color. Pick up the new color and begin knitting with it. Take care when picking up the new color not to pull the strand too tightly or too loosely it should just lay smoothly along the side of the Scarf.

STEP 1

With A, cast on 181 sts. **Row 1:** With A, k1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end of row. Rep Row 1 until piece measures about 2 in. (5 cm) from beginning.

STEP 2

Rows 1 and 2: With B, knit.
Row 3 (RS): With C, k1, *sl 1 with yarn in back, k1; rep from * to end of row.
Row 4: With C, k1, *sl 1 with yarn in front, k1; rep from * to end of row.
Rows 5-16: Rep Rows 1-4 for Slip st pattern.

STEP 3

Rows 1 and 2: With B, knit. Rows 3 and 4: With A, knit. Rows 5 and 6: With C, knit. Rows 7 and 8: With B, knit. Rows 9-14: Rep Rows 3-8. Rows 15 and 16: With A, knit. Cut A and B. Row 17: With C, knit. Bind off.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit
p = purl
rep = repeat

RS = right side sl = slip st(s) = stitch(es)
