Knitted items that get everyday use can be even more precious than heirloom quality pieces reserved for special occasions, because they serve as a constant reminder of the love and patience it took to knit them. SKILL LEVEL: Advanced Beginner

SIZE: One Size

20 in x 32 in [51cm x 81cm]

CORRECTIONS: None

MATERIALS

• 760-144 Lion Brand Lion Cotton: Grape

4 Balls (A)

• 760-210 Lion Brand Lion Cotton: Denim Swirl

1 Ball (B)

- Lion Brand Knitting Needles Size 10.5 [6.5 mm]
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook Size K-10.5

GAUGE:

Working with 2 strands held together, 14 sts and 20 rows = 4 in [10cm] over stitch pattern BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTES:

At first glance, this bath mat looks like it's knit in plain old garter stitch. Look a little more closely, and you'll see that the knit-purl pattern actually creates a fabric with a corrugated look. The mat is worked with two pieces of yarn stranded together to create a thick, sturdy fabric.

BATH MAT

With size US 10_ (6.5mm) needles and 2 strands of A cast on 70 sts and knit 2 rows.

BEGIN STITCH PATTERN

Row 1: k1, * k2, p2; rep from * to last st, k1. **Row 2:** k1, * p2, k2; rep from * to last st, k1.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until piece measures approximately 31 in [80cm], ending with row 2.

Knit 2 rows. Bind off all sts.

FINISHING

With 2 strands of B and size K crochet hook, work 1 round of slip stitch around edges of bathmat, then round of single crochet Weave in all ends.
