MATERIALS

- 861-195 Lion Brand Vanna's Glamour Yarn: Rhinestone Pink
2 Balls
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size F-5 (3.75 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

**Vanna's Glamour (Article #861). 96% Acrylic, 4% Metallic Polyester; package size: 1.75oz/49.61 gr. (202yds/185m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

19 dc + 8 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

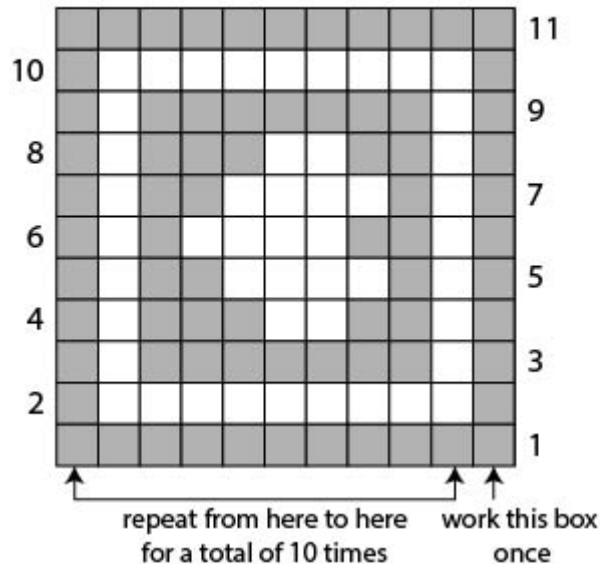
When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

1. Scarf is worked lengthwise in filet crochet.
2. Filet crochet uses dc sts and ch-sps to make empty and filled boxes. In this Scarf, the boxes are arranged to form a pattern of hearts. 10 filet crochet hearts are worked along the length of the Scarf.
3. Scarf can be made by following the written instructions or by reading the Chart. When working from Chart, read RS rows of the Chart from right to left and WS rows from left to right.
4. An edging is worked around outside edge of Scarf.

Filet Chart



Start every row with a ch 3 (this always counts as the first dc) and turn. Then work in filet crochet (filled and empty boxes) as shown on chart and as follows:

- = filled box - the shaded boxes on the chart represent 3 dc. These are worked in one of two ways - either by working a dc in each of next 3 dc OR by working 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc. Follow the written instructions for which way to work each shaded box.
- = empty box - the empty boxes on the chart are worked as follows: Ch 2, skip next 2 dc OR skip next ch-2 sp, then dc in next dc.

SCARF

Ch 306.

Row 1 (RS): Dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc) and in each ch across – 304 dc.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc in this row and in all following rows), turn, dc in next 3 dc, *[ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc] 9 times, dc in next 3 dc; repeat from * across – 124 dc and 90 ch-2 sps (10 sets of 9 ch-2 sps each).

Row 3: Ch 3, turn, dc in next 3 dc, *ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] 7 times, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc; rep from * across – 264 dc and 20 ch-2 sps (10 sets of 2 ch-2 sps each).

Row 4: Ch 3, turn, dc in next 3 dc, *ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 10 dc, [ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc] twice, dc in next 6 dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc; rep from * across – 224 dc and 40 ch-2 sps (10 sets of 4 ch-2 sps each).

Row 5: Ch 3, turn, dc in next 3 dc, *ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc, ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] twice, ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in next 7 dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc; rep from * across – 184 dc and 60 ch-2 sps (10 sets of 6 ch-2 sps each).

Rows 6 and 7: Ch 3, turn, dc in next 3 dc, *ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc, ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] 3 times, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc; rep from * across.

Row 8: Ch 3, turn, dc in next 3 dc, *ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 7 dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] twice, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc; rep from * across – 224 dc and 40 ch-2 sps (10 sets of 4 ch-2 sps each).

Row 9: Ch 3, turn, dc in next 3 dc, *ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 7 dc, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] twice, dc in next 9 dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc; rep from * across – 264 dc and 20 ch-2 sps (10 sets of 2 ch-2 sps each).

Row 10: Ch 3, turn, dc in next 3 dc, *ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc, [ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc] 7 times, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next 4 dc; rep from * across – 124 dc and 90 ch-2 sps (10 sets of 9 ch-2 sps each).

Row 11: Ch 3, turn, dc in next 3 dc, *[2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] 9 times, dc in next 3 dc; rep from * across – 304 dc.

Edging Round (RS): Ch 1, do not turn, (sc, ch 3, sc) in top of last dc worked; working in ends of rows across short edge, sk end of first row, (sc, ch 2, sc) in end of each of next 9 rows, sk end of last row; working across opposite side of foundation ch, (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch at base of first dc, *sk next ch, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch; rep from * to ch at base of last dc, sk ch at base of last dc, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch; working in ends of rows across remaining short edge, sk end of first row, (sc, ch 2, sc) in end of each of next 9 rows, sk end of last row; working in sts of Row 11, (sc, ch 3, sc) in first dc, **sk next dc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next dc; rep from ** across; join with slip st in first sc.
Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
