


LION BRAND[®] MICROSPUN Lace Tulip Baby Set



Skill Level: Intermediate

SIZE

Baby 6 (12) months Sweater: Finished chest 21 (24)" Length $9\frac{3}{4}$ (11¹/₄)" Hat (one size) 16" circumference Mittens (one size) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " circumference, $3\frac{1}{4}$ " length

MATERIALS

LION BRAND Microspun

3 (4) balls #100 Lily White

1 ball #143 Lavender

1 ball #194 Lime or colors of your choice

• Size 3 (3.25 mm) and 4 (3.5 mm) knitting needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE

• Six ¹/₂" (13 mm) buttons

• Large-eyed, blunt needle

GAUGE

24 sts + 32 rows = 4" (10 cm) in Stockinette st (k on RS, p on WS) with larger needles. BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATIONS

M1 (make 1) An increase worked by lifting horizontal thread lying between needles and placing it onto left needle. Work this new stitch through the back loop.

ssk (slip, slip, knit) Slip next 2 sts as if to knit, one at a time, to right needle; insert left needle into fronts of these 2 sts and k them tog.

BACK

With smaller needles, cast on 64 (72) sts. Work 6 rows K1, P1 Rib. Change to larger needles and work 2 rows St st. Row 9 K 3, [k2tog, yo, k 6] 7 (8) times, k2tog, yo, k 3.


Row 10 and all even rows Purl.

Rows 11, 13, 17, and 19 Knit.

Row 15 K 1, [k 6, k2tog, yo] 7 (8) times, k 7.

Row 20 Purl. Repeat Rows 9-20 four (five) times more, then

Rows 9-18 once. Bind off all sts.




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LEFT FRONT

With smaller needles, cast on 32 (36) sts. Work 6 rows K1, P1 Rib. Change to larger needles and work 2 rows St st. Row 9 K 3 (5), [k2tog, yo, k 6] 3 times, k2tog, yo, k 3 (5). Row 10 and all even rows Purl. Rows 11, 13, 17, and 19 Knit. Row 15 K 1 (3), [k 6, k2tog, yo] 3 times, k 7 (9). Row 20 Purl. Repeat Rows 9-20 four (five) times more. Row 69 (81) (RS) Repeat Row 9. Row 70 (82) (WS) Bind off 6 (7) sts, purl across - 26(29) sts. Row 71 (83) Knit. Row 72 (84) Bind off 3 (4) sts, purl across – 23 (25) sts. Row 73 (85) Knit. Row 74 (86) P2tog, purl across - 22 (24) sts. Row 75 (87) K 1 (3), [k 6, k2tog, yo] twice, k 5. Row 76 (88) P2tog, purl across - 21 (23) sts. Row 77 (89) Knit. Row 78 (90) Purl. Bind off all sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Work same as Left Front through Row 68 (80). Row 69 (81) (RS) Bind off 6 (7) sts, knit across. Rows 70 (82) and all even rows Purl. Row 71 (83) Bind off 3 (4) sts, knit across. Row 73 (85) K2tog, knit across. Row 75 (87) K2tog, k 4, [k2tog, yo, k 6] twice, k 1 (3). Row 77 (88) Knit. Row 78 (89) Purl. Bind off all sts.



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Row 61 Knit. Row 63 K 10, [k2tog, yo, k 6] 6 times, k 4. Row 65 Knit. Purl 1 row and bind off all sts. COLLAR Row 1 Knit. Row 2 and all even rows Purl. Row 3 [K2tog, yo] 30 (36) times, k 1 – picot row. Row 5 Knit. Change to larger needles. Row 7 K 1, [yo, ssk, k 1, k2tog, yo, k 1] 10 (12) times. Row 9 K 1, [yo, k 1, slip 1-k2tog-psso, k 1, yo, k 1] 10 (12) times. Row 11 K 1, [k2tog, yo, k 1, yo, ssk, k 1] 10 (12) times. Row 13 K2tog, [(k 1, yo) twice, k 1, slip 1-k2tog-psso] 9 (11) times, [k 1, yo] twice, k 1, ssk Bind off. Fold and sew picot hem.

Using 3 plies of lavender and green yarn, duplicate stitch design on sweater pieces (see chart).

FRONT BANDS

Button band With smaller needles and RS facing, pick up and k 49 (59) sts along Left Front.

Row 1 K 1, (p1, k1) across.

Work Seed st for 5 more rows, bind off in pattern.

Buttonhole band With smaller needles and RS facing, pick up and k 49 (59) sts along Right Front. Work 3 rows Seed st as above.

Row 4 (buttonhole row) K 1, p 1, k 1, [p2tog, yo, [p1, k1] 3 (4) times} 5 times, p2tog, yo, [p1, k1] twice.

Rows 5-6 Seed st.


Bind off in pattern.

MITTENS (make 2)

With smaller needles, cast on 33 sts.


Work 6 rows K1, P1 Rib. Change to larger needles and work 18 rows St st.

Dec Row K2tog across to last st, k1 - 17 sts. Repeat dec row once more -9 sts. Thread yarn through remaining stitches twice, gather and sew side seam of Mitten. Duplicate stitch tulip design (see chart) using 3 plies of yarn.



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HAT




Thread yarn through remaining stitches twice, gather and sew side seam of Hat.

Duplicate stitch design (see chart) using


3 plies of yarn.


DUPLICATE STATCH-1




DUPLICATE STITCH-3




PUPLICATE STITCH-2



DIAPLICATE STITCH - 4


