

LION BRAND® WOOL-EASE® FUN FUR Crochet Spiral Poncho



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Skill Level: Easy+

SIZE

One size fits most

Finished measurements

Poncho before fur trim

Length 13"
Width along hem 49"
Width at neck 12"
Fur Collar 3½ "
Hem 1" (approximately)

MATERIALS

- LION BRAND Wool-Ease
- 3 balls #126 Chocolate Brown (MC) or color of your choice
- LION BRAND Fun Fur
 - 2 balls #126 Chocolate (CC) or color of your choice
- Size J-10 (6 mm) crochet hook OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Size N-13 (9 mm) crochet hook
- Scrap of contrasting yarn for marker

GAUGE

9 dc + 6 rows = 4" (10 cm) in MC with smaller hook. 10 sc + 12 rows = 4" (10 cm) in CC with smaller hook. 5 sc + 8 rows = 4" (10 cm) in CC with 2 strands held together and larger hook. BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATIONS

Base ch/sc (Note This method creates a base chain and foundation row of sc at the same time: easy, sturdy and elastic, especially useful for necklines and waistlines.)

Start with a slip knot, ch 2, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook, draw up a loop, yo, draw through 1 loop, yo and draw through 2 loops — 1 single crochet with its own chain at bottom.

Work next stitch under loops of that chain. Insert hook under 2 loops at bottom of the previous stitch, draw up a loop, yo and draw through 1 loop, yo and draw through 2 loops. Repeat for length of foundation. dc2tog Yarn over, insert hook into st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops. Yarn over, insert hook into next st and draw up a loop. Yarn over, draw through 2 loops, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook.

dc3tog Yarn over, insert hook into st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops. [Yarn over, insert hook into next st and draw up a loop. Yarn over, draw through 2 loops] twice, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook.

Spiral Pattern

(Note The beginning of the row, the seam, tends to move backwards or spiral. Each repeat of the pattern makes a spiral section. To create Yoke, you will make increases to expand each spiral section.)

Inc Row (adds 1 dc to each spiral section)

Ch 3, 2 dc in first dc, dc in next dc to last 2 dc of section, dc2tog, ch 2. [3 dc in first dc of next section, dc in next dc to last 2 dc of section, dc2tog, ch 2] to end. Slip st in top of beg ch.

Even Row Ch 3, 2 dc in first dc, dc in next dc to last 3 dc of section, dc3tog, ch 2. [3 dc in first dc of next section, dc in next dc to last 3 dc of section, dc3tog, ch 2] to end. Slip st in top of beg ch.

NOTES

Poncho is worked from neck down in joined rounds, RS of work always facing. Keep the ch3 at the beginning of each row relaxed to avoid choking up the seam.

PONCHO

With MC and smaller hook, Base ch/sc 56. Join with slip st to first sc, being careful not to twist.

Rnd 1 (RS) Set up 14 spiral sections as follows:

Ch 3, 2 dc in first sc, dc next sc, dc2tog, ch 2, (3 dc in next sc, dc next sc, dc2tog, ch 2) 13 times. Slip st in top of beg ch. Do not turn.

Rnds 2-19 Work (Even Row, Inc Row) 9 times.

Rnd 20 Continuing on RS, ch 1, sc in same st as join, (sc in each dc, 2 sc in each ch2-space) around. Slip st in beg sc — 224 scs. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends and block Poncho to approximate measurements before adding trim.

Hem

Note Most efficient use of yarn is to do Hem first, holding together 1 strand each from 2 balls of CC. Use remaining yarn in Collar.

With 2 strands of CC held together and larger hook, RS facing, join with slip st in any sc at bottom edge of Poncho. Ch 1, sc in same sc, skip next sc, (sc in next sc, skip next sc) around, slip st in beg sc. Turn.

Next Rnd Ch 1, skip slip st, sc in each sc around, slip st in beg sc. Fasten off.

Collar

(Note Fun Fur, when worked sc in the round, always seems furrier on the wrong side, so Collar is designed to fold over to the outside of Poncho, wrong side of fur facing out.)

With a single strand of CC and smaller hook, RS facing, join with slip st in any ch of neck base ch.

Rnd 1 Ch 1, sc in same ch and in each ch around — 56 scs. Do not join. Place marker and continue to work in the round.

Rnd 2 (Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc) around — 84 scs.

Rnd 3-11 Work 9 rounds of sc on 84 sts. Slip st in beg of rnd. There should be enough yarn for these rows, making Collar approximately 31½2" deep. If you run out sooner, simply stop there. If you're left with yarn and want to make Collar larger, continue sc until used up. Then slip st in next sc, fasten off. Partial rounds will never be noticed.

Weave in ends.

BLOCKING

Wool-Ease and Fun Fur wash beautifully, so the wet-blocking method works well. Thoroughly wet Poncho by gently squeezing in cool water. Roll in towel(s) and gently press to remove excess water. Spread clean towel(s) on a carpeted floor or on a bed. Lay the damp Poncho on the towel(s) and gently ease it into shape, blocking to size, pinning where necessary. Allow to dry completely.

Doris Chan's designer's tip

I don't usually crochet over loose ends, preferring instead to thread them onto a needle and into the stitch of the work for neatness and security. The one exception is Fun Fur. Worked-over ends won't pull free, the strands blend into the work almost invisibly. When you run out and need to join a new ball, simply overlap the old and new strands by a couple of inches, work the next stitch or stitches with 2 strands, continue with the new yarn.

ch = chain dc(s) = double crochet(s)	RS = right side sc = single crochet st(s) = stitch(es) tog = together yo = yarn over

Wool-Ease (Article #620) solid, heather, sprinkles, and twist colors come in 3 oz/197 yd balls; prints, frosts, and glitter/multi-colors are 21/2 oz/162 yds

Fun Fur (Article #320) solid colors come in 13/4 oz/60 yd balls; Prints are 111/42 oz/57 yds
