# LEVEL 1-BEGINNER KNIT PONCHO lion brand® lion's pride® woolspun®

#### MATERIALS

• LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> LION'S PRIDE<sup>®</sup> WOOLSPUN<sup>®</sup> (Art. #671) #174 Evergreen 6 (9) balls or color of your choice

• LION BRAND<sup>®</sup> large-eyed blunt needle

#### **OTHER MATERIALS**

- Circular knitting needle size 10.5 (6.5 mm), 36 in. (91.5 cm) long
- 2 buttons, about 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in. (4.5 cm) diameter
- Sewing needle and thread

## SIZE

Small/Large (1X/2X)

**Note:** Pattern is written for smaller size with changes for larger size in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to both sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

#### GAUGE

12 stitches + 24 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter stitch (knit every row). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

#### NOTES

- 1. Two Rectangles are worked in alternating bands of simple knit and purl stitches then sewn together to make Poncho.
- 2. The collar is made separately then sewn to Poncho.

#### **STEP 1**

Cast on 90 (111) stitches.



# STEP 2


#### Knit 11 rows.

Begin knit and purl pattern Rows 1-6: Knit one row, purl one row. Rows 7-9: Knit. Row 10: Purl. Rows 11-15: Knit. Row 16: Purl. Rows 17 and 18: Knit.

Repeat Rows 1-18 twice. Repeat Rows 1-6 once more. Knit 6 rows. Bind off. Make a second Rectangle just the same as the first.


#### STEP 3

Sew Rectangles together.



STEP 4


Cast on 76 (96) stitches for Collar. Work in Garter stitch (knit every row) for 4 1/2 in. (11.5 cm). Bind off. Sew Collar to Poncho.



# STEP 5

#### Button Loops (make 2)

Cast on 20 stitches and, without working any rows, bind off. Sew button loops to Poncho. With sewing needle and thread, sew buttons to Poncho.



## FINISHING

Weave in ends.
