# Free Crochet Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn

## Lion Brand® Landscapes®

### Urban Shadows Hat

Pattern Number: L40313

**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy (Level 2)

**SIZE:** One Size

**Finished Circumference** About 17 in. (43 cm), will stretch to fit

**Finished Height** About 9 1/2 in. (24 cm)

**CORRECTIONS:** (applied Jan 22, 2015)

**Rows 6-33:** Rep Rows 2-5 ~~seven more times.~~ **until piece measures about 17 in. (43 cm) from beg, working a Row 4 as the last row you work.**

**Rows 34-36:** Rep Rows 2-4.

#### MATERIALS

- 545-206 Lion Brand Landscapes: Metropolis  
1 Ball

*\*Landscapes (Article #545). 100% acrylic;  
package size: 3.50oz/100.00 gr.  
(147yds/134m) pull skeins*

- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size I-9
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)



#### GAUGE:

16 dc and 8 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm)

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### NOTES:

1. Hat is worked as a rectangle then ends are sewed together to make Hat.
2. Top edge of Hat is gathered.

#### HAT

Ch 39.

**Row 1 (WS):** Dc in 4th ch from hook (3 beg ch count as first dc), dc in each ch across – 37 dc.

**Row 2:** Ch 5 (counts as dc, ch 2 in this row and in all following rows), turn, sk first 3 sts, sc in next st, \*ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in next st, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st; rep from \* to last 3 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st – 12 ch-2 sps, 7 dc, and 6 sc (for 6 pattern reps).

**Row 3:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, sk next ch-2 sp, 5 dc in next sc, \*sk next ch-2 sp, sc in next dc, sk next ch-2 sp, 5 dc in next sc; rep from \* to turning ch-sp, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch – Six 5-dc groups and 7 sc.  
**Row 4:** Ch 5, turn, sc in center dc of first 5-dc group, \*ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in next sc, ch 2, sc in center dc of next 5-dc group; rep from \* to last 3 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in last sc – 12 ch-2 sps, 7 dc, and 6 sc (for 6 pattern reps).

**Row 5:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, 2 dc in first ch-2 sp, dc in next st, \*2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next st; rep from \* to turning ch-sp, 2 dc in turning ch-sp, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch – 37 dc.

**Rows 6-33:** Rep Rows 2-5 until piece measures about 17 in. (43 cm) from beg, working a Row 4 as the last row you work.

Do not fasten off.

**Top Edging**

**Row 1:** Ch 1, do not turn, working across long side edge, sc around dc at end of first row, \*sk end of next row, 5 dc around dc at end of next row, sk end of next row, sc around dc at end of next row; rep from \* to last 3 rows, sk end of next row, 5 dc around dc at end of next row, sl st around dc at end of last row, sl st in base of dc at end of last row. Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

**FINISHING**

From WS with long yarn tail, sew short edges of piece together to make a tube.

**Tie**

Ch 90.

Fasten off.

Wrap tie around Hat about 1 1/2 in. (4 cm) below top edge and knot securely. Tie ends into a bow.

Weave in ends.
