• LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle

ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

• Circular knitting needle size 10.5 (6.5 mm), 29 in. (73.5 cm) long

GAUGE

14 sts + 19 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Stockinette st (k on RS, p on WS). **BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.**

NOTES

- 1. Afghan is worked in one piece in Stockinette st (k on RS, p on WS) with Garter st (k every row) borders.
- 2. A circular needle is used to accommodate the large number of stitches. Work back and forth on the circular needle as if working on straight needles.
- 3. The yarn color is changed to make stripes. To change color, cut the old color leaving a long yarn tail. Begin working with new color leaving a long beginning tail. If you like, knot the tails together until you finish the Afghan, then unknot them when you weave them in.

STEP 1

With L, cast on 130 sts.



STEP 2


Work in Garter st (k every row) for 5 rows.



STEP 3

Change to A.

With A, and beginning with a RS (knit) row, work in Stockinette st (k on RS, p on RS) for 20 rows.



STEP 4


Change to B.

With B, continue in Stockinette st for 20 rows. Change to C.

Continue in Stockinette st, working 20 rows each in the following color sequence, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J and K.

Change to L.

With L, work in Garter st for 5 rows. Bind off.



STEP 5

Side Borders (make 2)


With L, cast on 224 sts.

Work in Garter st for 5 rows.

Bind off.

Sew a Side Border to each long side of Afghan

bind off



FINISHING

Weave in ends.
