#### GAUGE:

14 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 1-9.  
One Square = about 11 x 11 in. (28 x 28 cm)

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

**square-join** Drop loop from hook, insert hook through corresponding ch of previous Square, return dropped loop to hook and draw loop through to front of piece.

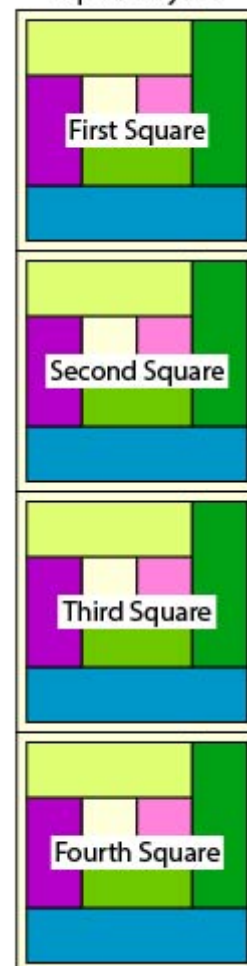
**NOTES:**

1. Runner is made from 4 Squares.
2. Each Square is made from 7 patches. Each patch is worked using a different color.
3. A Border is worked around the entire outer edge of each Square.
4. Patches are worked using a "join as you go" technique.
5. Blocks are joined while working the border around each Square. Refer to layout diagram for arrangement of Patches and Blocks.
6. An edging is worked around the entire outer edge of completed Runner.

**FIRST SQUARE****Patch 1**

With F, ch 40.

**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook, \*ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch; rep from \* across – at the end of this row you will have 20 sc and 19 ch-1 sps.

**Rows 2-9:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, \*ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc; rep from \* to end of row.  
Fasten off.

**Patch 2**

**Row 1 (RS):** From RS, join A with sc in 16th sc of last row of Patch 1, \*ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc; rep from \* to end of row – 5 sc and 4 ch-1 sps.

**Rows 2-18:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, \*ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc; rep from \* to end of row.  
Fasten off.

**Patch 3**

**Row 1 (RS):** From RS, join D with sc in 6th sc of last row of Patch 1, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 9 times, sl st in end of Row 1 of Patch 2 – 10 sc and 9 ch-1 sps.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 9 times.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 9 times, sl st in end of corresponding row of Patch 2.

**Rows 4-9:** Rep Rows 2 and 3.

Fasten off.

#### **Patch 4**

**Row 1 (RS):** From RS, join G with sc in 6th sc of last row of Patch 3, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times, sl st in end of Row 10 of Patch 2 – 5 sc and 4 ch-1 sps.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times, sl st in end of corresponding row of Patch 2.

**Rows 4-9:** Rep Rows 2 and 3.

Fasten off.

#### **Patch 5**

**Row 1 (RS):** From RS, join B with sc in first sc of last row of Patch 3, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times, sl st in end of Row 1 of Patch 4 – 5 sc and 4 ch-1 sps.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times, sl st in end of corresponding row of Patch 4.

**Rows 4-9:** Rep Rows 2 and 3.

Fasten off.

#### **Patch 6**

**Row 1 (RS):** From RS, join C with sc in first sc of last row of Patch 5, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times, ch 1, sk seam between Patch 5 and Patch 4, sc in first sc of Patch 4, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times, ch 1, sk seam between Patch 4 and Patch 2, sc in first sc of Patch 2, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times – 15 sc and 14 ch-1 sps.

**Row 2-9:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 14 times.

Fasten off.

#### **Patch 7**

**Row 1 (RS):** From RS, join E with sc in first sc of last row of Patch 1, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times, sl st in end of Row 1 of Patch 3 – 5 sc and 4 ch-1 sps.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, (ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc) 4 times, sl st in end of corresponding row of neighboring Patch.

**Rows 4-27:** Rep Rows 2 and 3.

Fasten off.

#### **Square Border**

**Rnd 1 (RS):** From RS, join G with sl st in first sc of last row of Patch 7, ch 4, sl st in same sc, (ch 2, sk next ch-1 sp or seam between Patches, sl st in next sc) 18 times, ch 2, sk next ch-1 sp, (sl st, ch 4, sl st) in corner sc; working along side edge, (ch 2, sk next row, sl st in end of next row) 17 times, ch 2, sk last row, (sl st, ch 4, sl st) in corner sc; working across opposite side of foundation ch, (ch 2, sk next ch, sl st in next ch) 18 times, ch 2, sk next ch, (sl st, ch 4, sl st) in corner sc; working along other side edge, (ch 2, sk next row, sl st in end of next row) 17 times, sk last row, ch 2; join with sl st in beg sl st.

Fasten off.

### **SECOND, THIRD AND FOURTH SQUARES**

Work same as First Square to Square Border.

#### **Square Border**

##### **Notes:**

1. Current Square is joined to previous Square when working Border.
2. The top of the current Square is joined to the lower edge of the previous Square.
3. Squares are joined by linking the corner ch-4 sps and the ch-2 sps across one edge of the Squares.
4. To link ch-sps, the loop on the hook is drawn through the corresponding ch-sp of the previous Square by working a "square-join" as defined in the Stitch Explanation section near the beg of these instructions.

**Joining Rnd 1 (RS):** From RS, join G with sl st in first sc of last row of Patch 7, hold top edge of current Square and lower edge of previous Square together with sts matching, ch 2, square-join through corner ch-4 sp of previous Square, ch 2, sl st in same sc, (ch 1, square-join through next ch-2 sp on previous Square, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp or seam between Patches on current Square, sl st in next sc) 18 times, ch 2, sk last ch-1 sp on current Square, (sl st, ch 2, square-join through corner ch-4 sp of previous Square, ch 2, sl st) in corner sc; working along side edge, (ch 2, sk next row, sl st in end of next row) 17 times, ch 2, sk last row, (sl st, ch 4, sl st) in corner sc; working across opposite side of foundation ch, (ch 2, sk next ch, sl st in next ch) 18 times, ch 2, sk next ch, (sl st ch 4, sl st in corner sc; working along other side edge, (ch 2, sk next row, sl st in end of next row) 17 times, sk last row, ch 2; join with sl st in beg sl st.

Fasten off.

### **FINISHING**

#### **Edging**

**Rnd 1 (RS):** From RS, join G with sl st in any ch-2 sp, ch 1, sl st in same sp, \*(ch 1, sc in next ch-2 or ch-4 sp) to next outer corner, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in outer corner; rep from \* 3 more times; (ch 1, sc in next ch-sp) to end of rnd, ch 1;

join with sl st in first sc.

**Rnds 2 and 3:** Ch 1, turn, sc in first ch-1 sp, \*(ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp) to next corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp; rep from \* 3 more times; (ch 1, sc in next ch-sp) to end of rnd, ch 1; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

**Rnd 4 (RS):** From RS, draw up a loop of D in any ch-1 sp, \*(ch 2, sl st in next ch-1 sp) to next corner ch-2 sp, ch 2, (sl st , ch 2, sl st) in corner ch-2 sp; rep from \* 3 more times, (ch 2, sl st in next ch-1 sp) to end of rnd, ch 2; join with sl st in same ch-1 sp as beg.

Fasten off.

Weave in ends.
