### The Animal Lover Hat

**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy + (Level 3)

**SIZE:** One Size

**Finished Circumference** About 16 in. (40.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes.

**Finished Height** About 9 in. (23 cm)

#### **MATERIALS**

- 861-153 [Lion Brand Vanna's Glamour](#)

Yarn: [Onyx](#)

2 Balls (A)

Yarn: [Gold](#)

2 Balls (B)

- [Lion Brand Double-Pointed Needles - Size 8](#)

*\*Vanna's Glamour® (Article #861). 96% Acrylic, 4% Metallic Polyester; package size: 1.75oz/49.61 gr. (202yds/185m) pull skeins*



#### **GAUGE:**

20 sts + 18 rnds = 4 in. (10 cm) in stranded colorwork with larger needles and 2 strands of yarn held tog.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### **STITCH EXPLANATION:**

**sk2p** Slip 1 as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over – 2 sts decreased.

### PATTERN STITCH

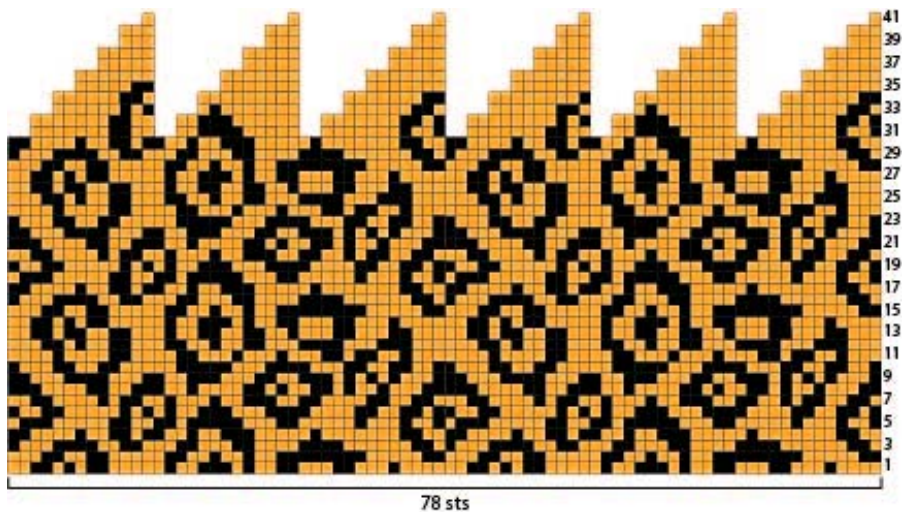
**K1, p1 Rib worked in rnds (over an even number of sts)**

**Rnd 1:** \*K1, p1; rep from \* to end of rnd.

Rep Rnd 1 for K1, p1 Rib worked in rnds.

### NOTES:

1. Hat is worked in rnds beg at lower edge, with 2 strands of yarn held tog.
2. Hat is worked in stranded colorwork following a Chart. Carry color not in use across WS of work. Read all rnds of Chart from right to left.



### HAT

With smaller double pointed needles and 2 strands of A held tog, cast on 78 sts.

Divide sts evenly onto 3 needles, with 26 sts on each needle. Place marker for beg of rnd. Join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist sts.

#### Ribbing

Work in K1, p1 Rib worked in rnds for 8 rnds.

#### Body

Change to larger double pointed needles.

Work in St st worked in rnds (k every rnd) and, beginning with Rnd 1, of Chart work until Rnd 30 has been completed.

#### Shape Crown (top of Hat)

Continue to follow Chart as you shape crown as follows:

**Rnd 31 (Decrease Rnd):** \*K10, sk2p, place marker; rep from \* 6 times – 66 sts at the end of the rnd.

**Rnd 32:** Knit, slipping markers as you come to them.

**Rnd 33:** \*K to 3 sts before marker, sk2p, slip marker; rep from \* 6 times – 54 sts.

Rep last 2 rnds until – 6 sts rem.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread yarn tail through rem sts and pull to gather. Knot securely.

### FINISHING

Weave in ends.
