#### **MATERIALS**

• 790-312 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Homespun Yarn:</u> <u>Edwardian</u>

1 Ball

- <u>Lion Brand Crochet</u>
   <u>Hook Size K-10.5</u>
   (6.5 mm)
- <u>Lion Brand</u>
   <u>Large-Eye Blunt</u>

   Needles (Set of 6)

\*Homespun® (Article #790). 98% Acrylic, 2% Polyester; package size: 6.00oz/170.00 gr. (185yds/169m) pull skeins



#### **GAUGE:**

11 double crochet = 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### **SCARF**

Chain 167.

Row 1: Double crochet in 4th chain from hook and in each chain across.

**Row 2:** Chain 3, turn. Working in front loops only, double crochet in each stitch across, end with a double crochet in top of the beginning chain.

**Row 3:** Chain 3, turn. Working in back loops only, double crochet in each stitch across, end with a double crochet in top of the beginning chain.

Repeat Rows 2 and 3 until piece measures about 6 in. (15 cm) from beginning.

Fast	ten	off.	
Finishing			

Weave in ends.
