- 134-249 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Country: New England</u> <u>Granite</u> 2 Balls (A)
- 134-273 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Country: Nantucket</u> 2 Balls (B)
- 134-223 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Country: Hampton Sunset</u> 2 Balls (C)
- 134-226 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Country: Bear Mountain</u> 2 Balls (D)
- 134-278 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Country: Kennebunk Teal</u> 2 Balls (E)
- 134-233 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Country: Campfire</u> 2 Balls (F)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook
  <u>- Size N-13 (9 mm)</u>
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

## GAUGE:

9 dc = about 4 in. (10 cm). One Square = about 14 x 14 in. (35.5 x 35.5 cm).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### Making a Gauge Swatch


# NOTES:

1. 12 squares are worked, then sewn tog to make Afghan.

\*<u>Country</u> (Article #134). 100% acrylic; package size: 5.00oz/141.75 gr. (156yds/143m) pull skeins



2. Each Square is worked in joined rnds with RS facing. Do not turn at end of rnds.



## SQUARE 1

With A, ch 6; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 3 (counts as first dc in this rnd and in all following rnds), work 11 dc in ring; join with sl st in top of beg ch.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, (2 dc, tr) in next st, (tr, 2 dc) in next st, \*dc in next st, (2 dc, tr) in next st, (tr, 2 dc) in next st; rep from \* around; join with sl st in top of beg ch – you will have 28 sts at the end of Rnd 2.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, dc in next 2 sts, (2 dc, tr) in next st, (tr, 2 dc) in next st, \*dc in next 5 sts, (2 dc, tr) in next st, (tr, 2 dc) in next st; rep from \* to last 2 sts, dc in last 2 sts; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 44 sts. **Rnd 4:** Ch 3, dc in next 4 sts, (2 dc, tr) in next st, (tr, 2 dc) in next st, \*dc in next 9 sts, (2 dc, tr) in next st, (tr, 2 dc) in next st; rep from \* to last 4 sts, dc in last 4 sts; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 60 sts.

Fasten off A.

Join B with sl st in joining st.

**Rnds 5-8:** With B, ch 3, \*dc in each dc to next tr, (2 dc, tr) in tr, (tr, 2 dc) in next tr; rep from \* 3 times, dc in each dc to end of rnd; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 124 sts at the end of Rnd 8. Fasten off.

## **SQUARE 2**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with C and Rnds 5-8 with D.

## **SQUARE 3**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with E and Rnds 5-8 with F.

#### **SQUARE 4**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with F and Rnds 5-8 with C.

## **SQUARE 5**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with B and Rnds 5-8 with E.

## **SQUARE 6**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with D and Rnds 5-8 with A.

## **SQUARE 7**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with B and Rnds 5-8 with A.

## **SQUARE 8**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with D and Rnds 5-8 with C.

## **SQUARE 9**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with F and Rnds 5-8 with E.

#### **SQUARE 10**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with C and Rnds 5-8 with F.

#### **SQUARE 11**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with E and Rnds 5-8 with B.

#### **SQUARE 12**

Work same as Square 1, working Rnds 1-4 with A and Rnds 5-8 with D.

## FINISHING

Following assembly diagram, sew Squares into 3 strips of 4 Squares each. Sew strips tog to make Afghan. Weave in ends.
