SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: One Size

Finished Circumference About 20 in. (51 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes.

MATERIALS

- 790-312 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Edwardian
1 Ball
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size K-10.5 (6.5 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

**Homespun® (Article #790). 98% Acrylic, 2% Polyester; package size: 6.00oz/170.00 gr. (185yds/169m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

10 sc + 10 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

Beret is worked in joined rnds, beg at top.

BERET

Ch 3.

Rnd 1 (RS): Work 10 hdc in 3rd ch from hook (beg ch does not count as a st); join with sl st in first hdc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, *sc in next st, ch 1; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc – 10 sc and 10 ch-1 sps.

Rnd 3: (Sl st, ch 1, 2 sc) in first ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next sc, 2 sc in next ch-1 sp; rep from * 8 more times, ch 1; join with sl st in first sc – 20 sc and 10 ch-1 sps.

Rnd 4: (Sl st, ch 1, sc) in next sc (2nd sc of first 2-sc group), 2 sc in next ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next ch-1 sp; rep from * 8 more times, ch 1; join with sl st in first sc – 30 sc and 10 ch-1 sps.

Rnd 5: (Sl st, ch 1, sc) in next sc, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next ch-1 sp; rep from * 8 more times, ch 1; join with sl st in first sc – 40 sc and 10 ch-1 sps.

Rnds 6-9: (Sl st, ch 1, sc) in next sc, sc in each sc to next ch-1 sp, 2 sc in ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next sc, sc in each sc to next ch-1 sp, 2 sc in ch-1 sp; rep from * 8 more times, ch 1; join with sl st in first sc – 80 sc and 10 ch-1 sps at the end of Rnd 9.

Rnds 10-13: Sl st in next sc, (sl st, ch 1, sc) in next sc, sc in each sc to next ch-1 sp, 2 sc in ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next 2 sc, sc in each sc to next ch-1 sp, 2 sc in ch-1 sp; rep from * 8 more times, ch 1; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnds 14-17: Sl st in each of next 2 sc, (sl st, ch 1, sc) in next sc, sc in each sc to next ch-1 sp, 2 sc in ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next 3 sc, sc in each sc to next ch-1 sp, 2 sc in ch-1 sp; rep from * 8 more times, ch 1; join with sl st in first sc – 40 sc and 10 ch-1 sps and the end of Rnd 17.

Rnd 18: Ch 1, sc in each sc and ch-1 sp around; join with sl st in first sc – 50 sc.

Rnds 19-22: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

Top Loop

From RS, join yarn with sl st at center top of Beret, ch 10, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing. Fold piece in half and sew end of loop to Beret.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
