MATERIALS

- 640-303 Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick Yarn: Constellation
1 Ball (A)
- 640-601 Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick Yarn: Hoyas
1 Ball (B)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size N-13 (9 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

**Wool-Ease Thick & Quick (Article #640).*

Solids, Heathers, Twists: 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool

Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4% Rayon

Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon

Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1% Metallic Poly; package size: Solids,

Heathers, Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m)

Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m)

Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)



GAUGE:

8 hdc + 5 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

1. Scarfie is worked in 3 sections. Section I is worked, then sts for Sections II and III are picked up along the edges of Section I.
2. Yarn color is changed to create stripes.
3. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the st. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

SCARFIE Section I

With A, ch 41.

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 40 sc.

Row 2: Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, working in front loops only, hdc in next st and in each st to last st; working in both loops, hdc in last st.

Row 3: Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, working in back loops only, hdc in next st and in each st to last st; working in both loops, hdc in last st.

Rows 4-9: Rep Rows 2 and 3.

Row 10: Ch 1, turn, working in front loops only, sc in each st to last st, working in both loops, sc in last st. Fasten off.

Section II

From RS, join B with sl st in corner of Section I so you are ready to work across a short edge.

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, work 15 sc evenly spaced across short edge.

Row 2: Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, working in front loops only, hdc in next st and in each st to last st; working in both loops, hdc in last st.

Row 3: Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, working in back loops only, hdc in next st and in each st to last st; working in both loops, hdc in last st.

Rows 4-17: Rep Rows 2 and 3.

Row 18: Rep Row 2.

Change to A.

Row 19: Rep Row 3.

Rows 20-23: Rep Rows 2 and 3.

Row 24: Ch 1, turn, working in front loops only, sl st in each st to last st; working in both loops, sl st in last st.

Fasten off.

Section III

From RS, join B with sl st in corner of Section I so you are ready to work across the remaining short edge of Section I.

Rows 1-24: Rep Rows 1-24 of Section II.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
