• 860-194 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Vanna's Choice Yarn:</u> Lime

2 Balls

<u>Lion Brand Crochet Hook</u>
 <u>Size I-9</u>

<u>Lion Brand Large-Eye</u>
 <u>Blunt Needles (Set of 6)</u>

Additional Materials
 One button, about 1 in.
 (2.5 cm) diameter
 Printed Duct Tape® 1 roll
 Cardboard

GAUGE:

13 sc = 4 in. (10 cm) with larger hook.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

- 1. Back, Front and Strap are crocheted separately, then sewn together to make the Bag.
- 2. Tape is applied to the completed Bag.

FRONT

Ch 36.

Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – you will have a total of 35 sts.

Row 1: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.

Rep Row 1 until piece measures about 9 in. (23 cm) from beg.

Fasten off.

BACK

Make same as Front.

STRAP

Ch 9.

Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – you will have a total of 8 sts.

Row 1: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.

Rep Row 1 until piece measures about 57 in. (145 cm) from beg.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew ends of Strap together to make a loop.

Assembly

Hold side edge of Strap against right top corner of Front.

Insert hook through both thicknesses and join yarn with a slip st. Working through both thicknesses, to join Strap to Front, work sc evenly spaced down side edge of Front, then across lower edge, and up the next side; then work sc evenly spaced along remaining side edge of Strap until you reach the corner when you began. Join with slip st in top of first sc.

Fasten off.

Rep to join Back of Bag to Strap.

Apply tape, centered along entire length of Strap.

Button Tab

Mark the center 6 sts along top edge of Bag Back.

From RS, join yarn with a sl st and sc in each of the marked 6 sts.

Row 1: Ch 1, turn, sc in each of the 6 sts.

Rows 2 and 3: Rep Row 1.

Buttonhole Row: Ch 1, turn, sc in 2 sc, ch 2, skip next 2 sc, sc in last 2 sc. **Next Row:** Ch 1, turn, sc in 2 sc, work 2 sc in chain space, sc in last 2 sc.

Last 2 Rows: Rep Row 1.

Fasten off.

Join yarn with a sl st in one corner at base of tab and sc evenly spaced around outside edge of tab. Fasten off.

Sew button to Bag Front, aligned with buttonhole.

Cut cardboard to fit inside bottom of Bag. Cover cardboard with tape.

Weave in ends.
