MATERIALS

- 640-154 [Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick Yarn: Grey Marble](#)
1 Ball
- [Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size N-13 \(9 mm\)](#)
- [Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles \(Set of 6\)](#)

**Wool-Ease Thick & Quick (Article #640).*

Solids, Heathers, Twists: 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool

Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4% Rayon

Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon

Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1%

Metallic Poly; package size: Solids, Heathers, Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m)

Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m)

Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)



GAUGE:

7 clusters + 7 rnds = about 8 in. (20.5 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

STITCH EXPLANATION:

beg-CI (beg cluster) Ch 2, dc in indicated st. **Note:** Although it is usual to have a ch 3 count as a dc, in this pattern a ch-2 counts as the first dc. The dc's in a cluster become just a bit shorter than the usual dc and the shorter chain is used to compensate for this.

CI (2 double crochet cluster) Yarn over, insert hook in indicated st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (2 loops remain on hook), yarn over, insert hook in *same* st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook.

Fsc (Foundation single crochet)

1. Ch 2 (counts as first Fsc), insert hook in 2nd ch from hook and draw up a loop; yarn over and draw through one loop on hook (the "chain"); yarn over and draw through 2 loops on

hook (the "single crochet").

2. Insert hook into the "chain" of the stitch just made and draw up a loop; yarn over and draw through one loop on hook (the "chain"), yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (the "single crochet"); repeat from * the total number of times indicated.

NOTES:

Circle Scarfie is worked in joined rnds with RS always facing.

CIRCLE SCARFIE

Leaving a long beg yarn tail, Fsc 50; join with sl st in first st to form a circle.

Rnd 1 (RS): Beg-Cl in same st as joining, *ch 1, sk next st, Cl in next st; rep from * to last st, ch 1, sk last st; join with sl st in top of beg-Cl – at the end of Rnd 1 you will have 25 clusters and 25 ch-1 sps.

Rnds 2-7: Sl st in first ch-1 sp, beg-cl in same sp, *ch 1, Cl in next ch-1 sp; rep from * around, ch 1; join with sl st in top of beg-Cl.

Rnd 8: Sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, sc in same sp, sl st in next Cl, *sc in next ch-1 sp, sl st in next Cl; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc.

FINISHING

With beg yarn tail, sew gap between first and last Fsc closed.

Weave in ends.
