

GAUGE:

 $7 \ 1/2 \ sc + 7 \ rows = about 4 \ in. (10 \ cm).$

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

1. Scarfie is worked in one piece, with the main portion in one color, the ends in contrast color. 2. Only one crochet st is used - the single crochet (sc). The sts alternate working through the front loop and then through the back loop - this creates a wonderful texture on the Scarfie. 3. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

Row 1: Ch 1, turn, sc in back loop of first st, *sc in front loop of next st, sc in back loop of next st; rep from * to last 2 sts, sc in front loop of next st, sc through both loops of last st.

Rows 2-14: Rep Row 1.

Row 15: Working in both loops, sc in each st across, changing to B in last st.

Next Row (RS): With B, ch 1, turn, working through both loops, sc in each st across.

With B, rep Row 1 until only a few yards (meters) of A remains, end with a wrong side row as the last row you work.

Next Row (RS): Ch 1, turn, working through both loops, sc in each st across, changing to A in last st. With A, rep Rows 1-15.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
