GAUGE:

1 Square = about 6×6 in. $(15.2 \times 15.2 \text{ cm})$. EXACT GAUGE IS NOT ESSENTIAL FOR THIS PROJECT.

NOTES:

- 1. Afghan is made from 42 Squares sewn tog following Assembly Diagram.
- 2. Each Square is worked in joined rnds with RS always facing.

3. Edging is worked around the entire outer edge of the assembled Afghan.



SQUARE I (make 12)

With B, ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 3 (counts as first dc on this rnd and on all following rnds), 2 dc in ring, ch 2, (3 dc in ring, ch 2) 3 times; join with sl st in top of beg ch – at the end of this rnd you will have 12 dc and 4 ch-2 sps.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, *dc in each dc to ch-2 sp, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in ch-2 sp; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch.

Rnd 3: Rep Rnd 2.

Fasten off B.

Rnd 4: From RS, join A with sl st in any ch-2 sp, ch 3, (dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same sp, dc in next 2 dc, (ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc) 4 times, dc in next dc, *(2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in ch-2 sp, dc in next 2 dc, (ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc) 4 times, dc in next dc; rep from * 2 more times; join with sl st in top of beg ch.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in same st, sc in next dc, *3 sc in ch-2 sp, sc in each dc and ch-1 sp; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of first sc.

Fasten off A.

SQUARE II (make 9)

Make same as Square 1, in following color sequence: Work Rnds 1-3 with C, Rnds 4-5 with A.

SQUARE III (make 6)

Make same as Square 1, in following color sequence: Work Rnds 1-3 with D, Rnds 4-5 with A.

SQUARE IV (make 6)

Make same as Square 1, in following color sequence: Work Rnds 1-3 with E, Rnds 4-5 with A.

SQUARE V (make 6)

Make same as Square 1, in following color sequence: Work Rnds 1-3 with F, Rnds 4-5 with A.

SQUARE VI (make 3)

Make same as Square 1, in following color sequence: Work Rnds 1-3 with G, Rnds 4-5 with A.

Following Assembly Diagram, sew Squares together into 7 strips of 6 squares each. Sew strips together.

EDGING

Rnd 1: From RS, join A with sl st in any sc along outer edge of Afghan, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in each sc around, working 5 dc in each corner.

Fasten off A.

Rnd 2: From RS, join G with sl st in any dc, ch 1, sc in the same st, sc in each dc around, working 3 sc in each corner.

Fasten off G.

Rnd 3: With A, rep Rnd 1.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
