### MATERIALS

- 640-143 [Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick Yarn: Claret](#) 1 Ball (A) *\*Wool-Ease Thick & Quick (Article #640). Solids, Heathers, Twists, Prints, Stripes: 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4% Rayon*
- 640-149 [Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick Yarn: Charcoal](#) 1 Ball (B) *Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon*
- [Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 13 \[9 mm\]](#) *Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1% Metallic Poly; package size: Solids, Heathers, Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m) Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m) Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)*

### GAUGE:

9 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Garter st (k every row).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

### STITCH EXPLANATION:

**w&t (wrap and turn)** A technique used to ensure that a small hole doesn't form at the end of a short row.

1. Slip next st as if to purl.
2. Bring yarn between needles to front. Take care not to wrap the yarn over a needle, this would create a new st.
3. Slip same st back to left needle.
4. Turn work and bring yarn in position for next st. This will place a yarn wrap around the st.
5. When next working the wrapped st, lift the wrap onto the left hand needle and knit it tog with the st.

## NOTES:

1. Scarfie is worked in one piece.
2. Short rows are used to create the color pattern.
3. When changing color, B is always joined and then cut when each B color pattern is completed; A is dropped and carried along the side of the piece until next needed.

## SCARFIE

With A, cast on 15 sts.

**Rows 1 and 2:** Sl 1, k to end of row.

**Row 3 (RS):** Sl 1, k11, w&t.

**Row 4:** K to end of row.

**Row 5:** Sl 1, k8, w&t.

**Row 6:** K to end of row.

**Row 7:** Sl 1, k5, w&t.

**Row 8:** K to end of row.

**Row 9:** Sl 1, k2, w&t.

**Row 10:** K to end of row.

Drop A and join B.

When working Rows 11-20, for wrapped sts, lift the wrap onto the left hand needle and k it tog with the st.

**Row 11:** With B, sl 1, k to end of row.

**Row 12:** Sl 1, k2, w&t.

**Row 13:** K to end of row.

**Row 14:** Sl 1, k5, w&t.

**Row 15:** K to end of row.

**Row 16:** Sl 1, k8, w&t.

**Row 17:** K to end of row.

**Row 18:** Sl 1, k11, w&t.

**Row 19:** K to end of row.

**Row 20:** Sl 1, k to end of row.

Cut B and pick up A.

Rep Rows 1-20 for 21 more times and ending with a Row 20.

Do not cut B at the end of the last rep.

Bind off with B.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends.
