batting
Sewing needle and
heavy duty thread
Fiberfill stuffing
Craft glue

GAUGE:

16 sts + 22 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in St st (k on RS, p on WS) with largest needles and A.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

kfb (knit in front and back) Knit next st without removing it from left needle, then k through back of same st – 1 st increased.

M1 (make 1) An increase worked by lifting the horizontal strand lying between needles and placing it onto left needle. Knit this new stitch through the back loop – 1 st increased.

ssk (slip, slip, knit) Slip next 2 sts as if to knit, one at a time, to right needle; insert left needle into fronts of these 2 sts and knit them tog – 1 st decreased.

sk2p (slip-k2tog-pass slipped st over)

A double decrease worked as follows:

1. Insert right needle as if to knit, and slip the next st from the left needle to the right needle.
2. Knit the next 2 sts together.
3. With tip of left needle, lift the slipped st (the 2nd st on right needle) up and over the k2tog (first st on right needle) and off the needle – you have decreased 2 sts.

Yo (yarn over)

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows:

1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.
2. Take yarn to back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

NOTES:

1. Batting is rolled into a cylinder, then covered with a strip of St st (k on RS, p on WS) to make Wreath.
2. Leaves, Poinsettias, Bobbles and Star are worked separately then sewn to Wreath. We encourage you to use your creativity and make these fanciful trims in colors as desired.

WREATH

With largest needles and A, cast on 46 sts.

With A, work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) for 20 rows Change to B and continue in St st for 20 rows.

Rep last 40 rows 5 times, then change to A and work 20 more rows in St st.

Bind off.

Wreath Assembly

Seam the short ends of piece tog to make a ring.

Lay batting flat with a short side in front of you. Roll batting away from you into a cylinder. With sewing

needle and thread, sew edge of batting to the cylinder. Bring ends of batting cylinder together and sew to make a ring.

Insert batting ring into knit ring, then seam long sides of knit piece together so that batting is completely enclosed.

Leaves (make 25)

Notes

1. Leaves are worked with C and one color of D. Use D color as desired, for our sample we used Bronze.

2. Leaves are worked in intarsia using a separate ball of yarn for each color. Do not carry unused color across WS of work. Twist yarns on WS to prevent holes.

With largest needles and C, cast on 5 sts.

Row 1 (RS): K2, yo, k1, yo, k2 – 7 sts.

Row 2: With C, purl.

Row 3: With C, k3, yo, k1, yo; join D and k3 – 9 sts.

Row 4: With D, p4; with C, p5.

Row 5: With C, k4, yo, k1, yo; with D, k4 – 11 sts.

Row 6: With D, p 5; with C, p6.

Row 7: With C, bind off 3 sts, (k1, yo) twice; with B, k5 – 10 sts.

Row 8: With D, bind off 3 sts, p1; with C, p5 – 7 sts.

Row 9: With C, k3, (yo, k1) twice; with D, k2 – 9 sts.

Row 10: With D, p3; with C, p6.

Row 11: With C, k4, (yo, k1) twice; with D, k3 – 11 sts.

Row 12: With D, p4; with C, p7.

Row 13: With C, bind off 3 sts, (k1, yo) twice, k1; with D, k4 – 10 sts.

Row 14: With D, bind off 3 sts, p1; with C, p5 – 7 sts.

Row 15: With C, ssk, k2; with D, k1, k2tog – 5 sts.

Row 16: With D, p3; with C, p2.

Row 17: With C, ssk; with D, k1, k2tog – 3 sts.

Row 18: With D, p3.

Row 19: With D, sk2p.

Fasten off last st.

Poinsettias (make 12)

Note: Use D colors as desired, we used hot pink, red and purple.

Petals (make 5 for each flower)

With smallest needles, cast on 3 sts.

Row 1 (Increase - RS): Kfb, k to last st, kfb – 5 sts.

Row 2: Purl.

Rows 3-6: Rep Rows 1 and 2 – 9 sts.

Work even (without increasing or decreasing) in St st for 1 in. (2.5 cm), end with a WS (purl) row as the last row you work.

Next Row (Decrease - RS): Ssk, k to last 2 sts, k2tog – 7 sts.

Next Rows: Purl.

Rep last 2 rows until 3 sts rem.

Last Row (RS): Sk2p.

Fasten off last st.

Sew 5 petals tog at one end. Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

Bobbles (make 12 each of Gold, Silver and Brass from D package)

With smallest needles, cast on 1 st.

Row 1 (WS): K in (front, back, front, back, front) of same st – 5 sts.

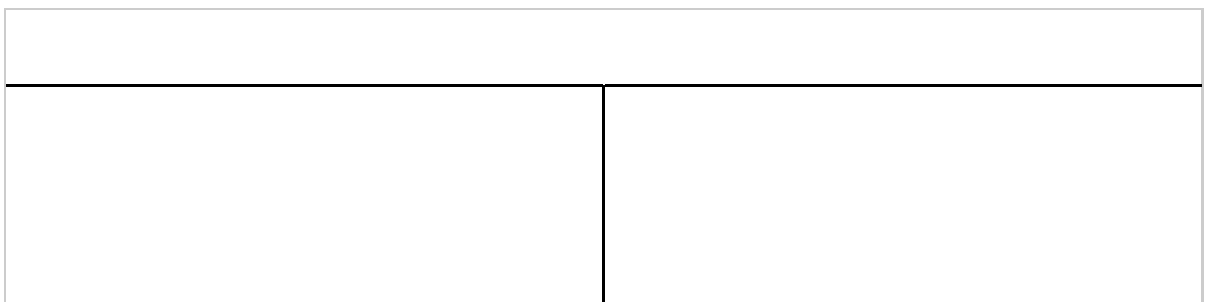
Work in rev St st (p on RS, k on WS) for 4 rows.

Pass last 4 sts over the first st.

Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

Sew 3 bobbles to each Flower center.

Star (make 2 – 1 Gold and 1 Copper from D package) Note:



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
