

MATERIALS

• 136-103 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Heartland Yarn: Denali</u>

1 Ball

<u>Lion Brand Crochet</u>
 <u>Hook - Size J-10 (6</u>
 mm)

• <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye</u> <u>Blunt Needles (Set of 6)</u> *<u>Heartland</u> (Article #136). **Solids:** 100%

Tweeds: 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon; package size: **Solids:** 5oz/142g (251yd/230m) **Tweeds:** 4oz/113g (200yd/183m)



GAUGE:

1 ripple = about 2 1/2 in. (6.5 cm) measured from peak to peak. 6 1/2 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

- 1. Circle Scarfie is worked in joined rnds in a ripple pattern, beg and ending with 2 rnds of single crochet. Rnds 2-18 are all worked through back loops.
- 2. The ripple pattern is easy to do, but it's important to remember that you may need to work several rnds before the ripple pattern becomes clear.
- 3. The ripple pattern consists of alternating (dc, ch 2, dc) peaks and skipped st valleys. Take care to keep the peaks and valleys of each row aligned. (Dc, ch 2, dc) is worked into the ch-2 sp of peaks and 2 sts are skipped centered at valleys.
- 4. If you find it difficult to join the beg ch into a ring without twisting the ch, Rnd 1 can be worked as a row, then joined into a rnd, as follows: Leaving a long beg tail, ch 121, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across; join with sl st in first sc you will have 120 sc. Use beg tail to sew gap at base of first row closed. Proceed to Rnd 2.

Ch 120; taking care not to twist ch, join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc in same ch as joining and in each ch around; join with sl st in first sc – you will have 120 sc at the end of Rnd 1.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, working through back loops only, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 3: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), working through back loops only, dc in next 3 sts, sk next 2 sts, dc in next 4 sts, *ch 2, dc in next 4 sts, sk next 2 sts, dc in next 4 sts; rep from * around, ch 2; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 12 ripples.

Rnds 4-16: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), working through back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 2 sts, sk next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, *(dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, dc in next 3 sts, sk next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts; rep from * to last ch-2 sp, dc in last ch-2 sp, ch 2; join with sl st in top of beg ch.

Rnd 17: Ch 1, working through back loops only, sc in each dc and ch around; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 18: Ch 1, working through back loops only, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
