SKILL LEVEL: Intermediate (Level 3)

SIZE: One Size

Finished circumference About 12 in. (30.5 cm), after felting

MATERIALS

- 150-123 Lion Brand Fishermen's Wool
Yarn: Oatmeal
1 Ball (A) **Fishermen's Wool® (Article #150). 100% Pure Virgin Wool*
202: 78% Pure Virgin Wool, 13% Acrylic, 9% Rayon; package size: 8 oz (227 g), 465 yards (425 m)
- 150-126 Lion Brand Fishermen's Wool
Yarn: Nature's Brown
1 Ball (B) **Pelt (Article #321). 68% Nylon, 32% Polyester; package size: 1.75oz/50.00 gr. (47yds/43m) pull skeins*
- 321-203 Lion Brand Pelt: Fisher
1 Ball (C)
- 601-660 Lion Brand Bonbons
Yarn: Celebrate
1 Ball (D) **Bonbons (Article #601).*
Cotton: 100% Cotton. **Care:** Machine Wash Cool, Gentle Cycle, Do Not Bleach, Dry Flat, Low Iron, Dry Clean Any Solvent Except Trichloroethylene.
Acrylic: 100% Acrylic. **Care:** Machine Wash and Dry, Do Not Bleach, Do Not Iron, Tumble Dry Normal, Dry Clean and Solvent Except Trichloroethylene.
Metallic: 96% Acrylic, 4% Metallic Polyester. **Care:** Machine Wash Cool, Lay Flat to Dry, Do Not Bleach, Do Not Iron, Dry Clean Any Solvent Except Trichloroethylene.; package size: **Cotton:** Weight Category 2: Sport Weight

GAUGE:

14 sts + 16 rnds = 4 in. (10 cm) in St st worked in the rnd (k every rnd) with A and using size 11 (8 mm) needles, before felting.

EXACT GAUGE IS NOT ESSENTIAL FOR THIS PROJECT.

STITCH EXPLANATION:

ssk (slip, slip, knit) Slip next 2 sts as if to knit, one at a time, to right needle; insert left needle into fronts of these 2 sts and knit them tog – 1 st decreased.

SPECIAL TECHNIQUE

3-Needle Bind Off

With RS together, hold in one hand 2 needles with equal number of sts on each. With 3rd needle, knit tog 1 st from each needle, *knit tog 1 st from each needle, pass first st worked over 2nd to bind off; rep from * across. Cut yarn and pull through last st to secure.

NOTES:

1. Stocking is worked in the rnd on double pointed needles from top of leg to toe and then felted.
2. Felting is not an exact science! Your piece may vary in size.
3. Short rows are worked to shape the heel. Short rows are simply rows worked over a portion of the sts.
4. Cuff, Cord Trim and Dots are worked separately then sewn to felted Stocking.
5. Cuff is worked separately, then sewed to top of felted Stocking.
6. D yarns are worked with 2 strands held together. Wind each D yarn into 2 separate balls before beginning.
7. When you see "– 12 sts" in the instructions, this lets you know how many sts you will have at the end of that specific row.

STOCKING

Leg

With larger double pointed needles and A, cast on 52 sts. Divide sts evenly onto 4 double pointed needles, with 13 sts on each needle. Place marker for beg of rnd and join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle.

Rnds 1-20: Work in St st worked in the rnd (k every rnd).

Rnd 21: *K1 with A, k1 with B; rep from * around.

Do not cut A, carry A across WS of piece until next needed.

Rnds 22-24: With B, work in St st worked in the rnd.

Rnd 25: Rep Rnd 21.

Cut B.

Rnds 26-38: With A, work in St st worked in the rnd.

Rnds 39-56: Rep Rnds 21-38.

Shape Heel Flap

Cut A and slip 13 sts from left hand needle to right hand needle. Slip next 26 sts to a stitch holder for instep (top of foot) – you will have 26 sts rem on one double pointed needle.

With WS facing and working on rem 26 sts only, join B and purl 1 row – 26 sts.

Work in St st worked in rows (k on RS, p on WS) until flap measures about 2 1/4 in. (5.5 cm), end with a RS row as the last row you work.

Turn Heel

Row 1 (WS): P15, p2tog, p1, turn, leave rem sts unworked.

Row 2: Sl 1, k5, k2tog, k1, turn, leave rem sts unworked.

Row 3: Sl 1, p6, p2tog, p1, turn, leave rem sts unworked.

Row 4: Sl 1, k7, k2tog, k1, turn, leave rem sts unworked.

Row 5: Sl 1, p8, p2tog, p1, turn, leave rem sts unworked.

Row 6: Sl 1, k9, k2tog, k1, turn, leave rem sts unworked.

Row 7: Sl 1, p10, p2tog, p1, turn, leave rem sts unworked.

Row 8: Sl 1 k11, k2tog, k1, turn, leave rem sts unworked.

Row 9: Sl 1, p12, p2tog, p1, turn.

Row 10: Sl 1, k13, k2tog, k1 – 16 heel sts.

Change to A.

Gusset

From RS, with one double pointed needle and A, pick up and k 11 sts evenly spaced along side edge of heel flap; with a 2nd needle, k across 26 sts from instep st holder; with a 3rd needle, pick up and k11 sts evenly spaced along side edge of heel flap, then k across 8 heel sts, place marker for beg of rnd; sl rem 8 heel sts onto first needle (19 sts on first and 3rd needles, 26 sts on 2nd needle) – 64 sts total.

Join to work in the rnd.

Knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 1 (Decrease): K to last 3 sts on first needle, k2tog, k1; knit across instep sts on 2nd needle; on 3rd needle, k1, ssk, k to end of rnd – you will have 62 sts at the end of this rnd.

Rnd 2: Knit.

Rnds 3-12: Rep Rnds 1 and 2 – 52 sts at the end of Rnd 12.

Knit 12 rnds.

Change to B.

Shape Toe

With B, knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 1: K to last 3 sts on first needle, k2tog, k1; on 2nd needle, k1, ssk, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; on 3rd needle, k1, ssk, k to end of rnd – 48 sts rem.

Rnd 2: Knit.

Rnds 3-12: Rep Rnds 1 and 2 – 28 sts at the end of Rnd 12.

Rnds 13-16: Rep Rnd 1 – 12 sts at the end of Rnd 16.

Remove beg of rnd marker, and with 3rd needle, k across sts on first needle – 6 sts on each of 2 needles. Turn Stocking inside out and use 3-Needle Bind-Off to close toe.

FINISHING

Hanging Loop

With A and 2 larger double pointed needles, cast on 3 sts.

Knit the 3 sts. Do not turn work. *Slide sts to other end of needle and knit them, pulling yarn tightly across the back of the work, (do not turn work); rep from * until loop measures about 6 in. (15 cm). Bind off, leaving a long yarn tail. Fold loop in half and sew ends inside top edge of Stocking.

Weave in ends.

Felting

Wash piece by machine on a hot wash/cold rinse cycle with detergent and several pieces of clothing to agitate. Pull into shape, then allow piece to dry thoroughly.

CUFF

With size 8 (5 mm) knitting needles and C, cast on 57 sts.

Work in Garter st (k every row) for about 2 1/2 in. (5.5 cm).

Bind off.

Sew side edges together.

Sew cast-on edge around top of felted Stocking.

Note: Work Cord Trim and Dots with D colors as desired.

CORD TRIM

With smaller double pointed needles and 2 strands of D held together, cast on 3 sts.

Work as for hanging loop until piece measures about 14 1/2 in. (37 cm) long.

Bind off.

Sew Cord to Stocking in an S-shape, curling the ends into spirals.

DOTS (make as many and in D colors as desired, our designer made 8, each in a different color)

With 2 strands of D held together and smaller double pointed needles, cast on 21 sts.

Knit 3 rows.

Pass all sts one at a time over first st and off the needle.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail and pull through last st to secure. With yarn tail, sew side edges together.

Sew Dots to front of Stocking as desired.

Weave in ends.
