#### MATERIALS

- 640-138 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Wool-Ease Thick & Quick</u> <u>Yarn: Cranberry</u> 1 Ball (A)
- 320-100 Lion Brand Fun Fur Yarn: White
  1 Ball (B)
- Lion Brand Knitting <u>Needles Size 11 [8 mm]</u>
- Lion Brand Knitting <u>Needles- Size 13 [9</u> mm]
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

\*<u>Wool-Ease Thick & Quick (</u>Article #640). Solids, Heathers, Twists, Prints, Stripes: 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4% Rayon Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1% Metallic Poly; package size: Solids, Heathers, Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m) Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m) Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)

\*<u>Fun Fur</u> (Article #320). 100% Polyester; package size: **Solids:** 1.75 oz/50g; 64 yd/58m balls **Prints:** 1.5 oz/40g; 57 yd/52m balls

*Exotics:* 1.75 oz/50g; 55 yd/50m balls (*Note:* Exotics shades are lay flat to dry)





#### GAUGE:

9 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) in St st (k on RS, p on WS) using larger needles and A.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### Making a Gauge Swatch

# NOTES:

1. Hat is worked back and forth in rows and then seamed.

2. Trim is worked with 3 strands of B held together. Wind B into 3 separate balls before beginning.

# HAT

With smaller needles and A, cast on 44 sts. Work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) until piece measures about 3 in. (7.5 cm) from beg.

Change to larger needles and continue in St st until piece measures about 10 in. (25.5 cm) from beg. **Decrease Row:** (K2tog) across – 22 sts at the end of this row.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread yarn tail through remaining sts and pull to gather. Knot securely. Do not cut remaining yarn tail.

## FINISHING

## Trim

From RS, with smaller needles and 3 strands of B held tog, pick up and k 44 sts evenly spaced across cast on edge of Hat.

**Next Row (WS):** \*K3, k into front and then back of next st (to increase 1 st); rep from \* around – 55 sts at the end of this row.

Beg with a RS (knit) row, work in St st for 1 3/4 in. (4.5 cm).

Bind off as follows: \*K2tog, slip st back onto left hand needle; rep from \* until all sts have been bound off. Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail.

With B yarn tail, seam B portion of Hat. With A yarn tail, seam A portion of Hat. Weave in ends.
