SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: Child (Multiple Sizes)

Child's XS (S, M, L, XL)

Finished Chest 23 (26, 28, 32, 34) in. (58.5 (66, 71, 81.5, 86.5) cm)

Finished Length 13 1/2 (14 1/2, 16, 19 1/2, 22) in. (34.5 (37, 40.5, 49.5, 56) cm)

MATERIALS

- 136-353 Lion Brand Heartland Yarn: Black Canyon Tweed
2 2, 3, 3, 4 Balls (A)
**Heartland (Article #136). Solids: 100% Acrylic
Tweeds: 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon;
package size: Solids: 5oz/142g (251yd/230m)
Tweeds: 4oz/113g (200yd/183m)*
- 136-350 Lion Brand Heartland Yarn: Mount Rainier Tweed
1 1, 2, 2, 3 Ball (B)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size J-10 (6 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

draw through all loops to complete st. Fasten off old color.

5. When you see '0' repeats in an instruction, this means that you should not perform that particular instruction, just skip to the next part of the instruction.

STRIPE SEQUENCE

*Work 6 rows with B, work 6 rows with A; rep from * for Stripe Sequence.

BACK

With A, ch 36 (40, 43, 49, 52).

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 35 (39, 42, 48, 51) sc.

Rows 2-4 (6, 8, 8, 10): Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, changing to B in the last st of the last row.

Note: Work the rest of the Back in Stripe Sequence, changing color in the last st of every 6th row.

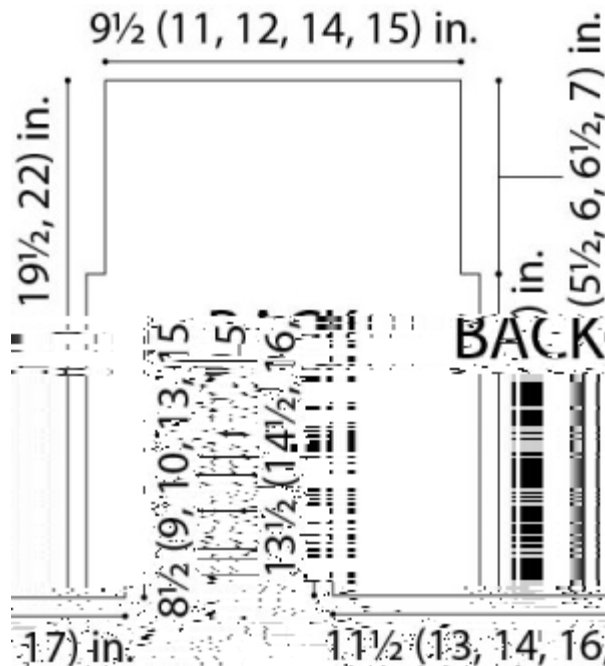
Row 5 (7, 9, 9, 11): With B, ch 2 (counts as first hdc in this row and in all following rows), turn, hdc in next st and each st across – 35 (39, 42, 48, 51) hdc.

Rep last row until piece measures about 8 1/2 (9, 10, 13, 15) in. (21.5 (23, 25.5, 33, 38) cm) from beg; end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Armholes

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sl st in next 3 sts, ch 2 (counts as hdc), hdc in next st and in each st to last 3 sts; leave last 3 sts unworked – 29 (33, 36, 42, 45) hdc.

Row 2: Ch 2, turn, hdc in next hdc and in each hdc across. Rep last row until piece measures about 13 1/2 (14 1/2, 16, 19 1/2, 22) in. (34.5 (37, 40.5, 49.5, 56) cm) from beg. Fasten off.



FRONT

Work same as Back until piece measures about 11 1/2 (12 1/2, 13 1/2, 17, 19 1/2) in. (29 (32, 34.5, 43, 49.5) cm) from beg; end with a WS row as the last row you work – 29 (33, 36, 42, 45) hdc.

Shape First Side of Neck

Row 1 (RS): Ch 2, turn, hdc in next 9 (10, 11, 14, 15) sts; leave rem sts unworked for front neck and second side of neck – 10 (11, 12, 15, 16) hdc.

Row 2 (Decrease Row): Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc in each st across – 9 (10, 11, 14, 15) hdc.

Row 3 (Decrease Row): Ch 2, turn, hdc in next st and in each st to last 3 sts, hdc2tog, hdc in last st – 8 (9, 10, 13, 14) hdc.

Rep last 2 rows until 6 (7, 9, 11, 12) sts rem.

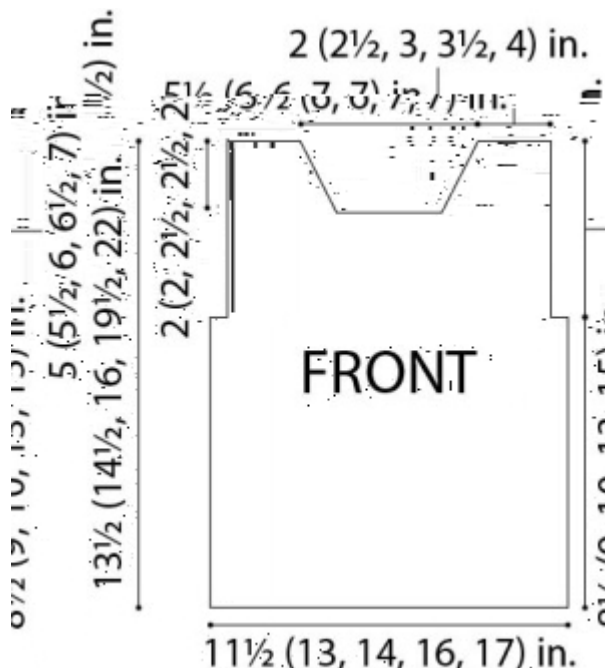
Note: Depending on the size you are making, the last row you work may be a Row 2 or a Row 3.

If needed, work even (without decreasing or increasing) in hdc until this side of piece measures same as Back.

Fasten off.

Shape Second Side of Neck

Row 1 (RS): From RS, sk next 9 (11, 12, 12, 13) unworked



sts following first side of neck, join yarn with sl st in next st, ch 2, hdc in next st and in each st to end of row – 10 (11, 12, 15, 16) hdc.

Row 2 (Decrease Row): Ch 2, turn, hdc in next st and in each st to last 3 sts, hdc2tog, hdc in last st – 9 (10, 11, 14, 15) hdc.

Row 3 (Decrease Row): Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc in each st across – 8 (9, 10, 13, 14) hdc.

Rep last 2 rows until 6 (7, 9, 11, 12) sts rem.

Note: Depending on the size you are making, the last row you work may be a Row 2 or a Row 3.

If needed, work even in hdc until this side of piece measures same as Back.

Fasten off.

SLEEVES (make 2)

With A, ch 17 (18, 19, 22, 23).

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 16 (17, 18, 21, 22) sts.

Rows 2-4 (6, 8, 8, 10): Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.

Shape Sleeve

Increase Row (RS): Ch 2 (counts as first hdc in this row and in all following rows), turn, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next st and in each st to last 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in last st – 18 (19, 20, 23, 24) hdc.

Next 1 (1, 1, 3, 3) Row(s): Ch 2, turn, hdc in next st and in each st across.

Rep Increase Row – 20 (21, 22, 25, 26) hdc.

Rep last 2 (2, 2, 4, 4) rows 3 (0, 2, 3, 3) more times – 26 (21, 26, 31, 32) hdc.

Next 3 Rows: Ch 2, turn, hdc in next st and in each st across.

Rep Increase Row – 28 (23, 28, 33, 34) hdc.

Rep last 4 rows 1 (5, 4, 3, 4) more time(s) – 30 (33, 36, 39, 42) hdc.

Next Row: Ch 2, turn, hdc in next st and in each st across.

Rep last row until piece measures about 9 (13 1/2, 14 1/2, 17, 18 1/2) in. (23 (34.5, 37, 43, 47) cm) from beg.

Fasten off.



FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams.

Neckband

Rnd 1 (RS): From RS, join A with a sl st at left shoulder seam, ch 1, work 25 (27, 30, 31, 32) sc evenly spaced across front neck edge, work 17 (19, 18, 20, 21) sc evenly spaced across back neck edge; join with sl st in first sc – 42 (46, 48, 51, 53) sc.

Next 1 (2, 2, 3, 3) Rnds: Ch 1, sc in each sc around; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

Sew in Sleeves.

Sew side and Sleeve seams.

Weave in ends.
