- 840-114 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Vanna's Choice Baby</u> <u>Yarn: Cheery Cherry</u> 2 Balls (A)
- 860-153 Lion Brand Vanna's Choice Yarn: Black
 1 Ball (B)
- 860-100 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Vanna's Choice Yarn:</u> <u>White</u>
- 1 Ball (C) • 860-172 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Vanna's Choice Yarn:</u> <u>Kelly Green</u> 1 Ball (D)
- 860-171 Lion Brand Vanna's Choice Yarn: <u>Fern</u>
 1 Ball (E)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size I-9
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of <u>6)</u>

GAUGE:

13 half double crochet = about 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

*<u>Vanna's Choice® Baby</u> (Article #840). 100% Premium Acrylic; package size: 3.50oz/100.00 gr. (170yds/156m) pull skeins



*<u>Vanna's Choice</u>® (Article #860). 100% Premium Acrylic **400, 401, 403:** 92% Acrylic, 8% Rayon **402:** 96% Acrylic, 4% Rayon; package size: **Solids:** 3.5 oz (100 g), 170 yards (156 m) **Prints, Tweeds, & Heathers:** 3 ozs (85 g) , 145 yards (133 meters) **Twists:** 2.5 oz (70 g), 121 yards (111 meters)



1. Scarf is worked in one piece, back and forth in rows.

2. Edging is worked along one long side edge of completed Scarf.

3. To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the stitch. Fasten off old color.

SCARF

With A, chain 20.

Row 1: Half double crochet in 3rd chain from hook (beginning 2 chain does not count as a stitch), half double crochet in each chain across – at the end of Row 1 you will have 18 stitches.

Rows 2-7: Chain 2 (does not count as a stitch), turn, half double crochet in each stitch across.

Row 8: Chain 2 (does not count as a stitch), turn, half double crochet in each stitch across, changing to B in last stitch.

Rows 9 and 10: With B, chain 1, turn, single crochet in each stitch across, changing to A in last stitch of Row 10.

Row 11: With A, chain 2 (does not count as a stitch), turn, half double crochet in each stitch across. Repeat Rows 2-11 for 14 more times.

Repeat Rows 2-8 once more.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Edging

Row 1: From RS, join A with a slip stitch in one corner of Scarf to work along one long edge; work single crochet evenly spaced across one long edge (we worked about 160 stitches), changing to C in last stitch. **Row 2:** With C, chain 1, turn, single crochet in each stitch across.

Note: Before going on to Row 3, cut 8 strands each of D and E, with each strand about 120 in. (305 cm) long.

You will use one strand for each D and E section on Row 4, changing color as in the Notes section at the beginning of this pattern, and leaving long yarn tails to weave in later. Set these strands aside, ready to use at the end of Row 3.

Row 3: With C, repeat Row 2, changing to one cut strand of D in the last stitch.

Row 4: With the one strand of D, chain 2 (does not count as a stitch), turn, half double crochet in first 10 stitches with D, changing to one strand of E in last stitch; *half double crochet in next 10 stitches with E, changing to D in last stitch; half double crochet in next 10 stitches with D, changing to one strand of E in last stitch; repeat from * to last 10 stitches, hdc in last 10 stitches with E.

Row 5: Chain 2, turn.

Working with the yarn strands connected to each section, half double crochet in first 10 stitches with E, changing to D in last stitch; *half double crochet in next 10 stitches with D, changing to E in last st; half double crochet in next 10 stitches with E, changing to D in last st; repeat from * to last 10 stitches, half double crochet in last 10 stitches with D.

Fasten off.

Weave in ends.
