SKILL LEVEL: Beginner (Level 1)

SIZE: Child (Multiple Sizes)

HAT

Child's XS (S, M, L)

Finished Circumference About 15 (16, 17, 18) in. (38 (40.5, 43, 45.5) cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes.

SCARF

About 7 x 50 in. (18 x 127 cm)

• 136-149 Lion Brand Heartland Yarn: Great **Smoky Mountains**

1 Ball (A)

• 136-173 Lion Brand Heartland Yarn: Everglades

1 Ball (B)

 Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 9 [5.5 mm]

• Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6) *Heartland (Article #136). Solids:

100% Acrylic

Tweeds: 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon; package size: Solids: 5oz/142g

(251yd/230m)

Tweeds: 4oz/113g (200yd/183m)



GAUGE:

16 sts + 32 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter st (knit every row).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

- 1. Hat is worked back and forth in rows in Garter st (knit every row) then seamed.
- When you see "- 12 sts" in the instructions, this lets you know how many sts you will have at the end of that specific row.

With A, cast on 60 (64, 68, 72) sts.

Rows 1-12: Knit.

Change to B.

Note: Do not cut yarn between stripes, carry color not in use along side edge of piece until next needed.

Rows 13-36 (36, 48, 48): Continuing in Garter st (k every row), work 6 rows each with B and A.

At the end of Row 36 (36, 48, 48), cut A and continue with B only.

Shape Crown (top of Hat)

Row 1: With B, knit.

Row 2: *K8 (6, 15, 7), k2tog; rep from * around – 54 (56, 64, 64) sts.

Rows 3, 5 and 7: Knit.

Row 4: *K7 (5, 6, 6), k2tog; rep from * around – 48 (48, 56, 56) sts.

Row 6: *K6 (6, 5, 5), k2tog; rep from * around – 42 (42, 48, 48) sts.

Row 8: *K5 (5, 4, 4), k2tog; rep from * around – 36 (36, 40, 40) sts.

Row 9: *K4 (4, 3, 3), k2tog; rep from * around – 30 (30, 32, 32) sts.

Row 10: *K3 (3, 2, 2), k2tog; rep from * around – 24 sts.

Row 11: *K1, k2tog; rep from * around – 16 sts.

Row 12: *K2tog; rep from * around – 8 sts.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail.

Thread yarn tail through remaining sts and pull to gather.

Knot securely.

FINISHING

Sew side edges of piece together to make Hat.

Weave in ends.

SCARF

With A, cast on 28 sts.

Knit 24 rows.

Change to B.

Continuing in Garter st (k every row), work 12 rows each with B and A until Scarf measures about 47 in. (119.5 cm) from beg, end with the last row (Row 12) of the B stripe.

Change to A.

With A, knit 24 rows.

Bind off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
