SIZE: Child (Multiple Sizes)

Child's XS (S, M, L, XL)

Finished chest 23 (26, 28, 32, 34) in. (58.5 (66, 71, 81.5, 86.5) cm)

Finished length 13 1/2 (14 1/2, 16, 19 1/2, 22) in. (34.5 (37, 40.5, 49.5, 56) cm)

MATERIALS

 136-180 <u>Lion Brand Heartland</u> <u>Yarn: Kings Canyon</u>
 1 1, 1, 2, 2 Ball (A)

• 136-105 <u>Lion Brand Heartland</u> Yarn: Glacier Bay

1 1, 1, 2, 2 Ball (B)

• <u>Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size</u> 9 [5.5 mm]

• <u>Lion Brand Double-Pointed</u> Needles - Size 9

• <u>Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch</u> Markers

<u>Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt</u>
 <u>Needles (Set of 6)</u>

*<u>Heartland</u> (Article #136). **Solids:** 100% Acrylic

Tweeds: 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon; package size: **Solids:** 5oz/142g (251yd/230m) **Tweeds:** 4oz/113g (200yd/183m)



GAUGE:

16 sts + 22 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in St st (k on RS, p on WS).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

M1 (make 1) An increase worked by lifting horizontal thread lying between needles and placing it onto left needle. Knit this new stitch through the back loop – 1 st increased. **ssk** (slip, slip, knit) Slip next 2 sts as if to knit, one at a time, to right needle; insert left needle into fronts of these 2 sts and knit them tog – 1 st decreased.

NOTES:

- 1. Pullover is worked in 4 pieces Back, Front and 2 Sleeves.
- 2. Lower edges of Pullover and Sleeves are worked in Garter st (knit every row).

3. Stitches are picked up along neck of Pullover to work neckband in Garter st worked in the rnd (k one rnd, p one rnd).

BACK

With straight needles and B, cast on 46 (52, 56, 64, 68) sts. Work in Garter st (k every row) for 7 (11, 15, 15, 19) rows. Change to A and work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) until piece measures about 8 1/2 (9, 10, 13, 15) in. (21.5 (23, 25.5, 33, 38) cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Armholes

Next Row (RS): Bind off 4 sts, k to end of row.

Next Row: Bind off 4 sts, p to end of row – 38 (44, 48, 56, 60) sts at the end of this row.

Work even in St st until piece measures about 13 1/2 (14 1/2, 16, 19 1/2, 22) in. (34.5 (37, 40.5, 49.5, 56) cm) from beg. Bind off.

FRONT

Cast on and work same as Back until piece measures about 8 1/2 (9, 10, 13, 15) in. (21.5 (23, 25.5, 33, 38) cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Armholes and Neck

Note: When working the neck and armhole shaping, you will be working both sides of the Front AT THE SAME TIME using separate balls of yarn.


Next Row (RS): Bind off 4 sts, k 16 (19, 21, 25, 27) [**Note:** you will have 17 (20, 22, 26, 28) sts on your right hand needle], k2tog, join a 2nd ball of yarn, ssk, k to end of row – you will have 18 (21, 23, 27, 29) sts on first side and 22 (25, 27, 31, 33) sts on second side.

Next Row: Bind off 4 sts, purl across sts of first side; with 2nd ball of yarn, purl across sts of second side – 18 (21, 23, 27, 29) sts on each side.

Next (Dec) Row (RS): On first side, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k last st; on second side, k1, ssk, k to end – 17 (20, 22, 26, 25) sts on each side.

Next Row (WS): Purl across sts of first side; then purl across sts of second side.

Rep last 2 rows until 8 (10, 12, 14, 16) sts rem on each side. Work even in St st until piece measures same length as Back. Bind off.



SLEEVES (make 2)

With straight needles and A, cast on 22 (24, 26, 28, 30) sts. Work in Garter st for 7 (11, 15, 15, 19) rows.

Change to B and, beginning with a WS (purl) row, work in St.


Change to B and, beginning with a WS (purl) row, work in St st for 3 rows.

Next Row (Inc Row) (RS): K1, M1, k to last st, M1, k1 – 24 (26, 28, 30, 32) sts.

Note: When you see '0' reps in the instructions, this means that for your specific size, you need not rep anything, simply continue to the next section of the instructions.

Continue in St st, AND AT THE SAME TIME, rep Inc Row every 4th row 8 (1, 3, 0, 0) more times, then every 6th row 0 (8, 7, 11, 12) times – 40 (44, 48, 52, 56) sts after all incs have been completed.

Work even in St st until piece measures about 9 (13 1/2, 14 1/2, 17, 18 1/2) in. (23 (34.5, 37, 43, 47) cm) from beg. Bind off.



FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams.

Neckband

From RS, with double-pointed needles and B, beginning at bottom point of V-neck, pick up and k19 (21, 23, 25, 27) sts evenly spaced along right front neck, 22 (24, 24, 28, 28) sts across back neck, then 19 (21, 23, 25, 27) sts along left front neck – 60 (66, 70, 78, 82) sts. Divide sts as evenly as possible onto 4 needles. Place marker for beg of rnd and join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle.

Note: After working a few rows, you may decide that your band would look better if you had picked up more or fewer sts than the amount indicated for your size.> Since a well-balanced band adds a beautiful finishing touch to your Cardigan, we strongly recommend that if you've any doubts, simply pull out the sts and adjust the number that you pick up. The pattern instruction reflects the number that the designer picked up – but everyone's knitting is a bit different.

Rnd 1 (Dec Rnd): P2tog, p to last 2 sts, p2tog – 58 (64, 68, 76, 80) sts at the end of this rnd. **Rnd 2:** Knit.

Rep last 2 rnds 0 (1, 1, 1, 2) more time(s), then rep Rnd 1 once more – 56 (60, 64, 72, 72) sts. Bind off.

Sew in Sleeves. Sew side and Sleeve seams.

Weave in ends.
