- 790-311 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Rococo
1 Ball (B)
- 790-368 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Montana Sky
1 Ball (C)
- 790-381 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Barley
1 Ball (D)
- 790-408 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Wild Fire
1 Ball (E)
- 790-404 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Lagoon
1 Ball (F)
- 790-407 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Painted Desert
1 Ball (G)
- 790-302 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Colonial
1 Ball (H)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size K-10.5 (6.5 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

**Homespun[®] (Article #790). 98% Acrylic, 2% Polyester; package size: 6.00oz/170.00 gr. (185yds/169m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

11 hdc + 7 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

1. Four Panels are worked separately, then sewn together following diagram to make Blanket.
2. The yarn color is changed every 17 rows on each Panel to create blocks of color.
3. To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the stitch. Fasten off old color.

PANEL I

With A, ch 30.

Row 1: Hdc in 3rd ch from hook (2 skipped ch do not count as a st) and in each ch across – 28 sts at the end of this row.

Row 2: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), turn, hdc in each st across.

Rows 3-17: Rep Row 2, changing to B in last st of Row 17.

Rows 18-34: With B, rep Row 2, changing to C in last st of Row 34.

Rows 35-51: With C, rep Row 2, changing to D in last st of Row 51.

Rows 52-68: With D, rep Row 2.

Fasten off.

PANEL II

Make same as Panel I, working 17 rows each with E, F, G and H.

PANEL III

Make same as Panel I, working 17 rows each of C, D, A and B.

PANEL IV

Make same as Panel I, working 17 rows each of G, H, E and F.

FINISHING

Following Assembly Diagram, sew long edges of Panels together, changing yarn color as needed so that the sewing yarn color matches the yarn in one of the Panels.

If desired, with G, work sl st as evenly as possible across bottom and/or top edges of finished Blanket. Weave in ends.
